from custody, conservatorships or in any other matter as provided by law. The court does not direct the county to pay any matters considered pursuant to civil procedure. Prior to this fiscal year the Superior Court of Riverside County paid reporters for these transcripts, however beginning in August 2009 the county began making payments retroactive to invoices submitted beginning on July 1, 2009. An additional \$400,000 is needed to make payments to court reporters through the end of the fiscal year.
