RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Adopt Ordinance No. 897, calling a special election and ordering its consolidation with the Statewide General Election for the purpose of submitting to the voters the proposition of whether a charter shall be adopted for the County; and

2. Approve the revised Riverside County Proposed Charter, attached to Resolution No. 2010-151.

BACKGROUND: On May 4, 2010, the Board of Supervisors introduced Ordinance No. 897 and approved Resolution No. 2010-151 proposing a Riverside County Charter for adoption by the voters at a special election consolidated with the statewide general election on November 2, 2010, subject to two revisions to the proposed charter: 1) clarifying that the



date of the special election will be specified by the Registrar of Voters no less than fifty-six (56) days, but no more than seventy (70) days after adoption of the ordinance calling for a special election; and 2) reducing the time to hold a special election from 180 days to 100 days if it can be consolidated with a statewide election. The revisions to the Proposed Riverside County Charter are attached.

Additionally, the Board authorized Supervisors Bob Buster and John Benoit to file a ballot argument (and any rebuttal) on behalf of the Board in support of the proposed Riverside County Charter, and further authorized the designated Board members to determine which other voters or associations may join in signing the argument/rebuttal.

County Counsel recommends the Board adopt Ordinance No. 897 and approve the revised Proposed Riverside County Charter attached to Resolution No. 2010-151. If approved, the single issue charter for the filling of Board vacancies will be placed before the voters on the November 2, 2010 ballot.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of California Government Code section 23711, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, on its own motion, may propose a charter and submit the proposal for adoption to the voters at any general or special election; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside has determined that it is in the best interests of the County of Riverside that a charter be enacted for the County of Riverside; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, in regular session assembled on May 4, 2010, that pursuant to California Government Code section 23711 the Proposed Riverside County Charter attached hereto and incorporated herein shall be submitted for adoption to the qualified voters of the County of Riverside at a special election to be consolidated with the statewide general election on November 2, 2010.



PREAMBLE

We, the citizens of Riverside County, with a desire for self-determination in selecting our county elected officials and to initiate the process to govern our county by charter government, do hereby adopt this charter.

ARTICLE 1 - BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

101. Governing Body.

The governing body of the county is a Board of Supervisors of five (5) members elected by and from designated supervisorial districts.

102. Terms of Office

The term of the office of supervisor is four (4) years.

103. Filling of Vacancies

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, whenever a vacancy occurs in the office of supervisor, the vacancy shall be filled as follows:

A. The remaining members of the Board shall, within thirty (30) days of the vacancy, fill the vacancy by doing one of the following: (i) appointing a successor for the unexpired term; (ii) calling a special election and appointing a successor to serve until the election and qualification of a candidate at the special election; or (iii) calling a special election. If the

remaining members of the Board fail to fill the vacancy within the thirty-day (30) period, the remaining members of the Board shall lose the discretion to fill the vacancy and shall immediately call a special election to fill such vacancy. A special election shall be held in the supervisorial district in which the vacancy occurred, on a date specified by the Registrar of Voters that is no less than fifty-six (56) days, but no more than seventy (70) days, after adoption of the ordinance calling the special election, except that special election may be held within one hundred (100) days after the adoption of such ordinance if the special election is consolidated with the next regularly scheduled statewide election. The person receiving the highest number of votes in the special election shall fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.

B. If only one candidate qualifies for a special election, the remaining members of the Board shall appoint that candidate to the vacancy for the unexpired term. The appointee shall serve exactly as if elected to such vacancy, and no special election to fill the vacancy shall be held.

C. The Board may authorize a special election to be conducted wholly by mail, unless the special election to be conducted by mail would occur on the same date as, or would be consolidated with, a statewide election. In no event shall a special election be conducted on the day after a state holiday.

ARTICLE II - GENERAL

201. Initiative and Referenda.

This charter does not abridge or modify the rights of citizens to propose initiatives and referenda (including amendments to this charter) as provided for in the general laws of the State of California.

202. General Law Governs.

Except as expressly set forth in this charter, the general law set forth in the Constitution of the State of California and the laws of the State of California shall govern the operations of the County of Riverside.

203. County Ordinances Enacted by the Voters Remain in Effect.

Ordinances of the County of Riverside adopted by the voters prior to the enactment of this charter shall remain in full force and effect and may only be modified or repealed by a vote of the people.

BACKGROUND: On April 6, 2010, the Board of Supervisors considered whether it should propose to the electorate the adoption of a County charter, the sole purpose of which would be to specify how Board vacancies are to be filled (hereinafter "charter proposal"). The Board asked staff to report on the charter process in general and to identify what would be required to place the charter proposal on the November 2010 ballot. The Board further requested an analysis of AB 1671 - proposed state legislation that relates to the filling of Board vacancies. (Continued)

Charters in General

A charter is a locally written and voter-approved document that serves as a county's own constitution. A charter is adopted by a majority vote of the electorate. A charter becomes effective once filed with the Secretary of State. A charter may be revised, amended or repealed in the same manner as it was adopted.

Other County Charters

Currently, fourteen (14) counties have charters (Alameda, Butte, El Dorado, Fresno, Los Angeles, Orange, Placer, Sacramento, San Bernardino, San Diego, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Tehama). Orange County has adopted a charter which solely addresses the filling of Board vacancies. The Orange County Charter successfully survived challenge in *The People ex rel. Joe Kerr v. County of Orange* (2003) 106 Cal.App.4th 914. A county by county overview of how vacancies are filled in these charter counties, prepared by Orange County, is attached hereto as Exhibit A.

Charter Proposal

The Board is considering a single issue charter that would specify how Board vacancies are to be filled. With respect to all other matters, general law set forth in the Constitution of the State of California and laws of the State of California would govern the operations of the County. The charter would not abridge or modify the rights of citizens to propose initiatives and referenda (including amendments to the charter) and would provide that any ordinances adopted by the electorate prior to enactment of the charter would remain in full force and effect and may only be modified or repealed by a vote of the electorate.

Should the Board decide to present the charter proposal to the electorate, it will need to determine whether it would like to retain the discretion to fill vacancies, call special elections to fill vacancies, or authorize the Governor to fill vacancies. The Board will also need to determine whether it wishes to require a Mail Ballot special election and whether it wishes to specify a window within which a special election may be held. Orange County's Charter, for example, attached hereto as Exhibit B, provides that a special election must be held "not less than fifty-six (56) days nor more than seventy (70) days after the vacancy occurs". If this Board does not specify an election window, a special election could be held no sooner than ninety (90) days after the vacancy occurs. The estimated cost of a special election is \$482,000.00 - \$532,000.00.

Statutory Requirements and Timelines Related to Placing a Charter Proposal on the Ballot

The Board of Supervisors, on its own motion, may submit the charter proposal to the electorate at either a general or special election, provided the proposal has been advertised at least eighty-eight (88) days before the election. (Government Code section 23711.) If the electorate votes in favor of the charter proposal, it would be deemed to be ratified, but would not take effect until accepted and filed by the Secretary of State. (Government Code section 23712.)

In order to place the charter proposal before the electorate at the November 4, 2010 general election, the charter proposal would need to be approved by the Board and submitted to the Registrar of Voters no later than August 6, 2010. The Special County Charter Measure Calendar prepared by the Registrar of Voters is attached hereto as Exhibit C.

AB 1671

Under existing law, the Governor is required to fill a Board vacancy. AB 1671 (Jefferies) as amended April 12, 2010, would require the Governor to fill the vacancy within ninety (90) days and, if the Governor failed to do so, would require the Board of Supervisors to do one of the following: (1) appoint an individual to fill the vacancy within ninety (90) days of the last day the Governor could have filled the vacancy, (2) call a special election to fill the vacancy or (3) authorize the Governor to appoint an individual to fill the vacancy within thirty (30) days of the Board's authorizing vote. If the Governor failed to appoint an individual within thirty (30) days of the authorizing vote, AB 1671 would require the Board of Supervisors to appoint an individual as specified in (1) above, call a special election as specified in (2) above, or vote to leave the vacancy open until the next regular election at which a successor could be elected. Any person appointed or elected would hold office until the election and qualification of his or her successor at the next general election. AB 1671 would apply only to general law counties, not charter counties.

A previous version of the bill took the power to fill a Board vacancy away from the Governor and vested it from the outset in the Board of Supervisors, but that version of the bill has been superseded by the April 12, 2010, version summarized above. Unless the bill is amended again to vest such power in the Board, a charter would give the Board greater control in the event of a vacancy
