SUBJECT: Approval of Grant Application to the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) for the Second Chance Act Technology Careers Training Demonstration Projects for Incarcerated Adults and Juveniles FY 2010

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to submit the BJA Technology Careers Training Grant;
- 2) Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to sign all grant application submission and grant award documents.

BACKGROUND: The Probation Department's grant application is proposing to set up a Technology Career and Training Center with technology-based career training programs for incarcerated juveniles. The Career and Training Center would be open for all eligible juveniles, ages 17-21, incarcerated at Indio Juvenile Hall. The Probation Department and the Economic Development Agency (EDA) will collaborate and coordinate services for the purpose of this grant for the special population of high risk juveniles within 7-15 months before their release. The grant will fund 1 FTE Supervising Probation Officer for the Probation Department and up to 1 FTE Development Specialist III for the EDA who will help develop and teach the curriculum for the technology-based career training programs, and provide assistance in career exploration, job opportunities and job search.
