**BACKGROUND:** On February 17, 2009, President Obama signed into law the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA; better known as Recovery Act) of 2009. On May 13, 2010, the California Emergency Management Agency (Cal-EMA) released Requests for Proposal for the Anti Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program. The Sheriff's Department has been notified that the County's grant application has been approved for the amount requested.

**BACKGROUND:** (continued)

Grant funds for the Anti Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program will be used to initiate and develop an expansive unified county approach to reduce human trafficking for the duration of this grant, July 1, 2010 through September 30, 2012. Funds will be used to create and retain positions on the team.

The Anti Human Trafficking Task Force Recovery Act Program will ensure the mulitdisciplinary participation with federal, state and local law enforcement agencies, prosecution and non-governmental organizations for the purpose of identifying trafficked victims.

In Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Riverside County Anti Human Trafficking grant will fund two (2) Sheriff Deputies, in addition to one (1) non-law enforcement personnel from Operation SafeHouse. The grant will aid in creating a full time Anti HumanTrafficking Task force for the County of Riverside. The primary goal of the Riverside County Anti Human Trafficking task force is to develop a database that will consist of all human trafficking victims rescued in addition to documenting the services provided to the victims. Also the task force will develop intelligence, conduct special operations, develop informants, interview suspects, interview victims of human trafficking and develop relationships with allied agencies. With the concurrence of the County Executive Office, two approved Deputy positions will be unfrozen and added to the Anti Human Trafficking Task Force.

Appropriations for this fiscal year total \$269,667. The remaining grant funds will be budgeted for FY 2011/2012. Staff has allocated \$125,000 of the funding to the task force's core collaborative partner, Operation SafeHouse, a non-governmental private, non-profit organization. For more than twenty years, Operation SafeHouse has been providing emergency shelter to homeless and runaway teens and youth in crisis in Riverside and the Coachella Valley. For this grant project, Operation SafeHouse will assess all identified human trafficking victims and refer them to appropriate services. Operation SafeHouse will accept all children referred by the Sheriff's Department for victims' assistance. The Board should note that, as a grant project partner, Operation SafeHouse, will be utilized as a sole source contractor.

The grant document has been approved as to form by County Counsel.
