SUBJECT: Approval of Resolution to Support Congressional Action to Authorize Legislation Regarding Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Programs.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors approve the attached Resolution to support the PACE Programs and transmit copies to the attached list of Congressional representatives and federal officials.

BACKGROUND:

In 2008, Governor Schwarzenegger signed AB 811, legislation authorizing local governments in California to designate areas within which officials and willing property owners may enter into contractual assessments to finance the installation of distributed generation renewable energy sources and energy efficiency improvements. The PACE program, implemented in the City of Palm Desert, has allowed property owners to borrow money from a newly established municipal financing district to finance energy retrofits and repay over twenty years through an annual special tax on property tax bill.

The Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) recently issued a statement that has effectively frozen residential Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) Programs across the country.

This resolution would call on Congressional representatives to approve legislation allowing PACE to continue.

RESOLUTION
in support of Congressional action regarding
Property Assessed Clean Energy
(PACE) Programs

WHEREAS, investing in cost-effective energy efficiency and renewable energy improvements to homes and businesses can save energy, cut utility bills, create thousands of local jobs, reduce reliance on fossil fuels, and dramatically reduce greenhouse gas emissions; and

WHEREAS, Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) financing programs are an innovative local government solution to help property owners finance energy efficient improvements to their homes and businesses; and

WHEREAS, California is among twenty two states to pass a law (AB 911, 2007-08) enabling local governments to develop PACE programs; and

WHEREAS, the City of Palm Desert, an original sponsor of AB 811 and the first jurisdiction in the U.S. to offer such loans for solar, has piloted this program to great effect, authorizing \$15 million and allocating \$6.9 million in PACE program funds for energy improvements; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Energy has dedicated \$150 million in grants to develop local PACE programs and issued guidelines to ensure they meet safety and soundness requirements and adequately protect both bond buyers and property owners; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Housing Finance Agency and the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency on July 6 issued statements that immediately forced existing PACE programs to halt operations and froze the development of dozens on PACE programs nationwide; and

WHEREAS, Riverside County possesses the weather conditions, technological expertise, and entrepreneurial spirit necessary to lead the nation and the world in renewable energy generation, and the PACE program adopted in Palm Desert and sought for other Riverside County communities is one step towards a brighter, cleaner future;

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors encourages Congress to support legislation that clearly guarantees the right of state and local governments to form special assessment districts to promote clean energy programs and restore the promise of PACE, and that the Clerk of the Board transmit copies of this resolution to appropriate Members of Congress and federal officials.
