**SUBJECT:** REPORT ON APPLICATION OF FIRE STATION CLOSURE CRITERIA

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** That the Board of Supervisors:

1. Receive and file the attached report from the County Fire Chief on the application of fire station closure criteria.
2. Direct the County Executive Officer to immediately proceed, with the cooperation of the Fire Chief, to begin station closures and ensure fiscal solvency.

**BACKGROUND:** As a part of the Board's approval of the FY 2010/11 First Quarter Budget report (3.24 Nov. 9, 2010) the Board approved criteria that would be used to determine which fire stations would be closed in order to realize budget savings during the current fiscal year. The attached report contains the resulting recommended actions to achieve cost savings. Closure of fire stations, while difficult, is necessary to ensure the Fire Department operates within a balanced budget.

Dear Mr. Luna:

As a follow up to previous direction from the Executive Office and the Board of Supervisors, I am submitting recommended budget reductions for the Riverside County Fire Department. We feel the reductions represent the best choice of bad alternatives; there is no simple answer to the gap between public safety expectations and funds available to deliver those services. We have followed Board adopted direction on closure required criteria for fire stations. Of course, if times were not as dire as they are and if revenues were matching cost expenditures, we would never bring forward these suggested reductions. We also hope the recommendations will be considered temporary so when the economy recovers we can request reinstatement of reduced services.

Since the reductions won't be effective until about January 1, 2011, we have estimated savings at 5.5 months for the duration of FY 10-11. The suggested reductions are, in reality, equal to double the impact due the effective implementation date. We feel carrying the cost reductions forward into FY 11-12 will possibly cover the expected 5% reduction for the next fiscal year.

The following represents a brief summary of services proposed for reduction. More in-depth information immediately follows this cover letter specifically detailing reductions by program and location.

- Reduce three fire stations (FS 51, El Cariso; FS 63, Poppet Flats; FS 77, Lake Riverside) from career staffed paramedic engine companies to Reserve Volunteer Firefighter staffed engine companies. Paramedic service would no longer be provided. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$1,310,208.
- Close one 3-person career staffed paramedic engine company (FS 43, Blythe) and staff two contiguous fire stations (FS 44, Ripley & FS 45, Blythe Airport) with 4-person paramedic firefighter service. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$299,141.

- Close one 3-person paramedic engine company (FS 15, El Cerrito) and contract with an adjacent city to protect the area. Paramedic service would be provided. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$171,945.
- Close one 3-person career staffed paramedic engine company (FS 18, W. Riverside) and instead staff a 2-person firefighter paramedic squad at the same fire station. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$160,294.
- Close one 3-person career staffed paramedic engine company (FS 42, Oasis) and instead staff a 2-person firefighter paramedic squad at the next nearest fire station (FS 40, Mecca). Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$213,181.
- Convert one single person breathing support unit (FS 90, N. Perris) from career staffing to Reserve Volunteer Firefighter staffing and relocate the other career staffed breathing support unit (FS 35, Roy Wilson) to the Pass area (FS 24, Cabazon). Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$82,925.
- Replace CAL FIRE staffing of two Fire Captains in Strategic Planning Bureau with County personnel. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$43,041.
- CAL FIRE adjustments to assist partner County with budget reductions. Approximate total savings for FY 10-11 is \$1,260,445.
  - Move 2<sup>nd</sup> CAL FIRE engine from FS 1, Perris, to FS 9, Goodmeadow, and close County 3-person paramedic engine company at FS 9. County to add firefighter paramedic to reassigned CAL FIRE engine. Three person staffing and paramedic service would remain. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$278,454.
  - Move 2<sup>nd</sup> CAL FIRE engine from FS 10, Lake Elsinore, to FS 96, Glenoaks, and close County 3-person paramedic engine company at FS 96. County to add firefighter paramedic to reassigned CAL FIRE engine. Three person staffing and paramedic service would remain. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$371,537.
  - Move 2<sup>nd</sup> CAL FIRE engine from FS 20, Beaumont, to FS 22, Cherry Valley, and close County 3-person paramedic engine company at FS 22. County to add firefighter paramedic to reassigned CAL FIRE engine. Three person staffing and paramedic service would remain. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$278,454.
  - Close 2-person paramedic squad at FS 28, Sage, and assign one paramedic firefighter to CAL FIRE engine at FS 28. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$166,000.
  - Close 2-person paramedic squad at FS 29, Anza, and assign one paramedic firefighter to CAL FIRE engine at FS 29. County to fund paramedic firefighter. Approximate savings for FY 10-11 is \$166,000.

These reductions approximate \$4.38 million. Our budget reduction target was about \$4.3 million.

CAL FIRE has really assisted by agreeing to allow the reassignment of State fire engines to closed county fire stations. This will be a win-win fiscal and operational partnership for a 2-3 year trial period. It will be re-evaluated in the short term for long term advantages. The movement of CAL FIRE personnel and equipment will provide better service for the State mission while maintaining service to the county.



All reductions involving CAL FIRE personnel will require a labor relations meet and confer session between CAL FIRE management and CDF Firefighters, Local 2881. The meet and confer will consider impact bargaining.

Throughout this entire budget reduction process, we sought to retain, as much as is operationally and fiscally possible, community fire and medical emergency response requirements. Our entire plan is based on continuing to deliver service to the public without complaining about required budget reductions.

## Riverside County Fire Department 10/11 Budget Reduction Plan

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### **Fire Station Closure Criteria adopted by the Board of Supervisors:**

- Emergency incident workload both within the first due area of the fire station and in nearby backup response areas however just because a fire station runs fewer alarms doesn't mean it will have less impact on the regional delivery of services
  - Proximity to other system fire stations using the existing Fire Department criteria for response based on community population density and land use.
    - Current density response criteria
      - 5 minutes, Heavy Urban (large commercial industrial zone & 8-20 dwelling units/acre)
      - 7 minutes, Urban (Light industrial zones & 2-8 single family dwelling units/acre)
      - 11 minutes, Rural (Very low density & 1 dwelling unit/acre)
      - 17 minutes, Outlying (Rural mountain & desert, agricultural & 1 dwelling unit/5 acres)
  - Redundancy of services at a fire station.
  - Ability of available Volunteer Firefighters or other, non-system fire departments to fill the void under contract.
  - Status of fire station infrastructure.
  - Not excessively passing County responsibility to city partner fire stations beyond their normal cooperative, integrated response areas.

**Close RVC FS 43, Blythe, and upgrade RVC FS 44, Ripley, and RVC FS 45, Blythe Airport, 4-person daily staffing.** (Currently with 3 stations in Blythe there are 9 firefighters on duty each day. This conversion will leave 8 firefighters on each day.)

- Reduces 3 Fire Captains
- Reduces 4 Fire Apparatus Engineers
- Adds 1 Firefighter/Paramedic

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$299,141

**Close RVC FS 15, El Cerrito, and contract with Corona City Fire to cover El Cerrito response area**

- Reduces 2 Fire Captains
- Reduces 2 Fire Apparatus Engineers
- Reduces 2 Firefighter/Paramedics
- Requires a payment of \$600,000 annually to Corona Fire to service the area (\$300,000 for remainder of 10/11)

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$171,945

**Convert RVC FS 18, West Riverside, E-18 from a 3-person medic engine to a 2-person medic Squad. Fire engine coverage will be provided by the CAL FIRE engine from April – December.**

- Reduces 1 Fire Captain
- Reduces 2 Firefighter/Paramedics

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$160,294

**Close RVC FS 42, Oasis, and shift personnel to staff a Medic Squad at FS 40, Mecca.**

- Reduces 3 Fire Captains
- Reduces 1 Fire Apparatus Engineers
- Adds 1 Firefighter/Paramedic

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$213,181

**Convert RVC West Breathing Support Unit from Career Staff to Volunteer/Reserve Staff & Move East Breathing Support to Central County Location.**

**Un-staff RVC FS 22, Cherry Valley, E-22 and reassign a CAL FIRE Engine from FS 20, Beaumont, to cover the area. Place county funded Paramedic Firefighters on the CAL FIRE Engine.**

- Reduces 1 Fire Captain
- Reduces 2 Fire Apparatus Engineers
- Reduces 2 Firefighter/Paramedics

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$278,454

**Un-staff RVC FS 96, Glen Oaks, E-96 and reassign a CAL FIRE Engine from FS 10, Lake Elsinore, to cover the area. We will place county funded Paramedic Firefighters on the CAL FIRE Engine.**

- Reduces 3 Fire Captains
- Reduces 3 Fire Apparatus Engineers

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**Miscellaneous Budget Adjustments**

**Operating Cost Savings.** With the staffing conversions and station closures listed above we expect to see a reduction operating costs of approximately \$500,000 annually and about half of that amount this fiscal year.

Total FY 10/11 Savings = \$300,000

**Service Mitigation Reimbursement.** We are scheduled to receive approximately \$500,000 of additional revenue that can be allocated for operations. This revenue is being generated from two commercial solar energy plants being build in Eastern Riverside County.

## Urgent Message to all RRU CDF Firefighter Bargaining Unit 8 Personnel

On December 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010, Riverside Unit Chief John Hawkins submitted to the Riverside County Board of Supervisors a County Fire Budget Proposal that included some dramatic reductions within the Riverside County Fire Department. These proposed reductions are a result of an on-going effort to reduce the existing deficit in the current Riverside County Budget. All County Departments have been tasked to propose similar measures in reducing their budgets.

The purpose of this letter is to update all RRU Local 2881 members of the recent developments and proposed reductions to the Cal Fire/ Riverside County Fire Budget. Specifically, I want to address the letter that was sent on Wednesday December 1<sup>st</sup> 2010 by Riverside Unit Chief John Hawkins to Riverside County Executive Officer Bill Luna and the Riverside County Board of Supervisors. In this letter, he recommended some reductions to the county fire budget that will have dramatic impact to our membership and the citizens we protect.


Let's face it; there are some very complex issues in front of us. Unfortunately, we must inform you that this union was not invited by RRU management to participate in making these latest decisions and recommendations. Our involvement is absolute when the end results will have such impact to each and every one of us. We understand that these are very difficult times and it is our position that there must be transparency with the decisions being made and it is vital in order to move forward. It is the position of the CDF Firefighters Riverside Chapter that we should have been involved with this process and have made this request so that we might have an opportunity to bring new ideas forward.

We believe that other options and ideas should be considered before the full implementation of Chief Hawkins' recommendations. The most recent Riverside County Fire Study developed by the County describes that our current staffing levels should not be compromised to which we agree and will remain committed to. We also have grave concerns that many of the cuts are borne by those of us on the station floor and it is equally suspect that permanent promotions are being made in light of our existing fiscal crisis.

I want you to know that we have been working very hard to prevent the closure of any fire station or front line fire equipment. We are outright offended by the suggestion of closing fire stations and having volunteers take our seats.

Since Chief Hawkins sent his letter, we have had many discussions and meetings with various individuals including Chief Hawkins working to find some sense of relief. It is anticipated that the Board of Supervisors will decide the fate of our budget next Tuesday.

I would like all of you to know that we are doing everything in our power to deal with these issues and as we receive further information, we will update you. But, we must face the facts that some or maybe all of these recommendations will be implemented.

RE: El Cariso Fire Station – Personnel Changes

Gentlemen:

It is with concern that I ask you to carefully consider the potential change before you regarding the El Cariso Fire Station on the Ortega Highway. As President of the Lake Elsinore Unified School District Board of Trustees, I well understand the sobering task you are facing in operating under shrinking budgets while doing your best to maintain services. These are very difficult economic times and I can only ask that all options are considered by you.

The issue here is the possibility of removing professional and seasoned firefighters and paramedics with a replacement of volunteers. While I have the highest respect for volunteers, I am very concerned about the El Cariso Station being staffed in this manner for the following reasons:

1. Explosive growth in Southwestern Riverside County caused the Ortega Highway to go from a quiet rural highway to a 25,000 per car a day computer highway with still only two lanes, many curves, dangerous driving issues and many accidents. It is the most dangerous and most fatal stretch of road in Riverside County.

The El Cariso Station is already isolated and very rural. To eliminate professional and fulltime firefighters for volunteers who may staff the station on a sporadic basis is limiting the experience and timeliness of responding to auto accidents with serious injuries and possible fatalities. The distance between San Juan Capistrano and Lake Elsinore is too far (35 miles) to have an unmanned or volunteer only station in this high traffic and high fire zone.

2. Paramedic calls may become a serious concern due to the distance and response time to get on top of the mountain and then to individual homes. We all know that there are time limits in responding to heart attacks and strokes let alone accidents.

I would ask that as you review the closure and or staffing changes of stations you please consider not only the operating cost of a particular location but the distance to other

stations, the response time, and the type of calls that station responds to. In the case of El Cariso, the response time for auto accidents on the Ortega Highway can make the difference between life and death.

I am not sure if this means that all paramedics will be removed from 24 hour duty @ the fire station. If it does this is my response



I would like to express my extreme concern regarding the removal of the in-house paramedics from the El Cariso fire station.

As an RN, I understand the need for rapid response for the best outcome when there is trauma or critical injury/illness.

The response time and quality of the initial treatment that the person receives has a direct impact on the outcome. Volunteers, although helpful in some circumstances, do not have the licensure, skills or experience to evaluate a patient and treat appropriately in a timely effective manner.

How long would it take for an ambulance carrying professional EMS personnel to arrive if it were coming from Elsinore or San Juan Capistrano? How would it affect someone with:

- Blunt chest trauma/open chest wounds and the person is unable to breath and requires urgent intubation or resuscitation... or a person with a pneumothorax? Can a volunteer provide rapid response, needle decompression, IV fluids or medications to support blood pressure?
- How much delay would be tolerable for someone with respiratory emergencies-asthma/pulmonary embolism/anaphylaxis?
- How long can someone survive with cardiac emergencies and unstable heart rhythms? EMS can evaluate and begin appropriate treatment with cardiac monitoring and providing an emergency access line into the veins for medications and /or defibrillation without the prolonged delay of transport arrival.
- How long is too long to start IV fluid support for blood pressure during hemorrhage?
- What would be the outcome of delayed treatment and transport with a spinal trauma case or massive head wound that demands EMS skill to evaluate, intubate and possibly sedate with IV medications, keep an open airway and observe and report on changes in physical and mental status to the receiving ER?
- How long a wait is too long if there is a poisoning or overdose or snakebite involving one of the local residents or hikers in the area?

I don't have the answer to these questions, but I know easily what can happen with delays in care. I understand difficult financial decisions need to be made from time to time, but I believe they should not be made without considering risk to human life.

As to your questions;

Volunteers are managed by the county, they have very limited experience and train respond from home to the fire station (when available) and then to the reported er creating longer response times This is a problem when you consider that a house f doubles in size every 60 seconds and irreversible brain damage occurs after 4-6 mi without breathing or circulation.

A person can have a paramedic license and be a volunteer but is only authorized to ALS (advanced life support) procedures when working (being paid and covered for his/her accrediting department. If not, he/she is limited to EMT (emergency medic technician) skills. The volunteer apparatus will not carry ALS equipment (heart mo defibrillator, drug box) anyways. You cant work without your tools!

As for response standards, this is often done by time. X minutes for BLS (basic life and Y minutes for ALS. when you consider that the volunteer must first get the al what they are doing, drive to the fire station observing all traffic laws, don PPE's (p protective equipment), wait for other volunteers to arrive (You cant take the engine yourself), Get the address, check the map etc, and then are at best BLS equipped, big difference. I cannot speak the to the effect it will have on insurance costs and but I can't imagine it improving things.

The only possible reason that I can think of for the paid professional crew to be rer from this station is that a "bean counter" in finance looked at it and noticed that it calls annually then average, so it is logical to close the slower stations. When you the FACTS that this remote location has extended response times, a high occurrence traumatic injury (vehicle accidents on Ortega Hwy, hang glider point, off highway v park), and very high risk of fire, the county has the responsibility of providing adeq and EMS services, and an all volunteer company will fall short of this.

There are many more points that I could go into, but I hope this give you an idea c REDUCING SERVICE would do for our community.
