RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Directors:

1. Conduct a public hearing in accordance with Health and Safety Code Section 33679;
2. Make the following findings pursuant to Health and Safety Code Section 33445:
 - a) The Cajalco Road Widening Project will benefit the Mead Valley Sub-Area of the I-215 Corridor Redevelopment Project Area by helping to eliminate blight within the project area by improving traffic circulation and by providing traffic signalization infrastructure that will enhance pedestrian safety for the community;
 - b) No other reasonable means of financing the cost of the project are available to the community due to the fact that the current economic crisis has substantially reduced the community's revenues to fund the project;

- c) The payment of funds for the cost of the project is consistent with the implementation plan for the project area and is necessary to effectuate the purpose of the project area's Redevelopment Plan, which calls for construction of infrastructure improvements and identifies roads as a needed public improvement; and
3. Approve and authorize the Chairman of the Board to execute the attached agreement by and between the Redevelopment Agency and the Riverside County Transportation Department (RCTD) in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,500,000, for the widening of Cajalco Road between Barton Street and Interstate 215.

BACKGROUND:

The Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside has been working with staff of RCTD to develop a plan for the widening of Cajalco Road from Interstate 215 (I-215) to Interstate 15 (I-15) in order to assist in improving traffic safety, and revitalize the substandard physical and economic conditions that exist within the project area. The project is located within the limits of the Mead Valley Sub-Area, in the I-215 Redevelopment Project Area.

However, the Agency is proposing to partially fund the project from Barton Street to I-215 by providing RCTD with a total of \$1,500,000, for the administration of the project including survey, preparation of technical studies, environmental clearance, right-of-entry services, the installation of a traffic signal, and its associated street improvements at the intersection of Alexander Street and Cajalco Road.

This project will assist in eliminating blighting conditions by constructing needed improvements that will enhance the flow of traffic and improve safety standards for the residents of Mead Valley.

Staff recommends that the Board conduct a public hearing regarding the proposed project, make the aforementioned findings, and approve the attached agreement between the Agency and RCTD for the project in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,500,000.

Summary Report: Cajalco Widening Project

(As required by Section 33679 of the Health and Safety Code: Community Redevelopment Law)

- Project Description:** The Cajalco Road Widening Project consists of the widening of the existing road from two lanes to four lanes. The Project also proposes to install a traffic signal and its associated street improvements at the intersection of Cajalco Road and Alexander Street.
- Project Site:** The Project is located in the unincorporated community of Mead Valley in the Interstate 215 Corridor Redevelopment Project Area. Project boundaries are from Interstate 215 to Barton Street along Cajalco Road.
- Project Cost:** The total project cost is estimated at \$16,650,000 and will be partially funded by the Redevelopment Agency. The Agency is proposing to reimburse RCTD a total of \$1,500,000.
- Findings:** The following findings have been made pursuant to Section 33445 of the Health and Safety Code:
- A. The proposed Cajalco Road Widening Project is of benefit to the Interstate 215 Corridor Project Area by helping to eliminate blight within the Project Area through improving traffic circulation and by providing traffic signalization infrastructure that will enhance pedestrian safety for the community within the Project Area.
 - B. No other reasonable means of financing the Project are available to the community due to the fact that the current economic crisis has substantially reduced the community's revenues to fund the Project.
 - C. The payment of funds for the cost of the Project is consistent with the Implementation Plan for the Project Area and is necessary to effectuate the purpose of the Project Area's Redevelopment Plan, which calls for construction of infrastructure improvements.

Purpose:

The proposed Project meets the following goals of the Interstate 215 Corridor Project Area:

- A. The road will be improved by providing additional lanes which will help alleviate the flow of traffic and improve safety.
- B. The proposed signal at the intersection of Cajalco Road and Alexander Street will improve pedestrian safety to the residents of the community.

Use of Redevelopment funds for the Cajalco Widening Project located in the unincorporated community of Mead Valley, within the Interstate 215 Corridor Project Area. The project consists of widening the existing road from 2 lanes to 4 lanes, and the installation of a traffic signal and associated street improvements at the intersection of Cajalco Road and Alexander Street. The Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside will reimburse the Riverside County Transportation Department a total of \$1,500,000 for the project.

1 **AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN**
2 **THE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY FOR THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE**
3 **AND THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE**
4 **FOR THE WIDENING OF CAJALCO ROAD BETWEEN**
5 **BARTON STREET AND INTERSTATE 215**
6 **INCLUDING TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF ALEXANDER STREET AND**
7 **CAJALCO ROAD**

8 **THIS AGREEMENT**, is entered on this 25th day of January, 2010, by and between the
9 Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside (hereinafter referred to as "Agency") and the
10 County of Riverside by and through its Transportation Department (hereinafter referred to as "RCTD")
11 for the preliminary engineering, design, and construction of the proposed widening of Cajalco Road
12 (hereinafter referred to as "PROJECT") located between Barton Street and Interstate 215, including the
13 installation of a traffic signal, and its associated street improvements at the intersection of Alexander
14 Street and Cajalco Road, in the unincorporated community of Mead Valley in Riverside County.

15 **WITNESSETH**

16 **WHEREAS**, Agency is a redevelopment agency duly created, established and authorized to
17 transact business and exercise its powers, all under and pursuant to the provisions of the Community
18 Redevelopment Law ("CRL") which is Part 1 of Division 24 of the California Health and Safety Code
19 (commencing with Section 33000 et seq.); and

20 **WHEREAS**, Section 33445 of the California Health and Safety Code provides that a
21 redevelopment agency may pay all or part of the cost of the construction of any building, facility,
22 structure or other improvement which is to be publicly owned and is located within or outside of a
23 redevelopment project area upon making certain findings; and

24 **WHEREAS**, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors Adopted, by Ordinance No. 821, on
25 July 16, 2002, a redevelopment plan for an area within the County known as the Redevelopment Project
Area Interstate I-215 Corridor, Sub-Area: Mead Valley (hereinafter referred to as "Project Area"), and

WHEREAS, the Project Area was adopted in order to eliminate blight and revitalize the
substandard physical and economic conditions that exist within the Project Area; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Section 33220 of the Community Redevelopment Law permits Agency and
2 RCTD to cooperate and assist each other in certain redevelopment activities that are the subject of this
3 Agreement; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Agency and RCTD have determined that there is a need for “PROJECT” on
5 Cajalco Road between the limits of Barton Street and Interstate 215 and will enhance public safety; and

6 **WHEREAS**, the Agency agrees to reimburse RCTD for the costs associated with the
7 preliminary engineering, design, and construction of the PROJECT using redevelopment funds.

8 **NOW, THEREFORE**, based upon the covenants, conditions, provisions, and mutual promises
9 contained herein, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

10 **SECTION 1. Purpose of the Agreement.** The purpose of this Agreement is to assist in
11 improving public transportation facilities by designing and constructing the PROJECT on Cajalco Road
12 between the limits of Barton Street and Interstate 215.

13 **SECTION 2. Location of the Project.** The project site is located in the unincorporated
14 community of Mead Valley in Riverside County on Cajalco Road, between Barton Street and Interstate
15 215, as shown in the attached Exhibit “A”.

16 **SECTION 3. Scope of Services.** The work to be performed by RCTD shall include survey,
17 preparation of technical studies, preparation of plans, specifications and estimates, utility coordination,
18 preparation of special studies, environmental clearance, right-of-entry services, the installation of a
19 traffic signal at the intersection of Alexander Street and Cajalco Road, and administration of PROJECT
20 in accordance with the local Agency Public Contract Code and the California Labor Code.

21 **SECTION 4. The Contractor.** The contractor(s) for the PROJECT (“the Contractor”) will be
22 selected by RCTD pursuant to the Public Contract Code. RCTD shall be responsible for all services and
23 acts performed by the contractor.

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1 **SECTION 5. Disbursement of Funds.** Agency shall reimburse RCTD for the actual cost of
2 the PROJECT in the amount not to exceed one million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000), as
3 detailed in Exhibit "B".

4 RCTD will be reimbursed upon Agency's receipt of journal vouchers issued by RCTD for the
5 services specified in this Agreement. A written project status report shall be included with each journal
6 voucher. Said status report shall provide a description of the work completed. Any necessary
7 corrections to journal voucher or project status may result in a delay of payment. All costs incurred for
8 actual work completed by RCTD must be billed to Agency within 12 months from completion of
9 services specified in this Agreement in order to receive payment. Any journal voucher received after
10 this time will be returned to RCTD without payment and Agency will reprogram any remaining funds.

11 **SECTION 6. RCTD and Other Governmental Agency Permits.** RCTD agrees to obtain,
12 secure or cause to be secured any and all permits and/or clearances which may be required by the
13 County of Riverside or any other federal, state or local governmental or regulatory agency relating to
14 the PROJECT that is the subject of this Agreement.

SECTION 8. Conflict of Interest. No member, official or employee of Agency or RCTD
shall have any personal interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement nor shall any such member, official

1 or employee participate in any decision relating to this Agreement which affects his or her personal
2 interest or the interests of any corporation, partnership or association in which he or she is directly or
3 indirectly interested.

4 **SECTION 9. Interpretation and Governing Law.** This Agreement and any dispute arising
5 hereunder shall be governed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California. This
6 agreement shall be construed as a whole according to its fair language and common meaning to achieve
7 the objectives and purposes of the parties hereto, and the rule of construction to the effect that
8 ambiguities are to be resolved against the drafting party shall not be employed in interpreting this
9 Agreement, all parties having been represented by counsel in the negotiation and preparation hereof.

10 **SECTION 10. No Third-Party Beneficiaries.** This Agreement is made and entered into for
11 the sole protection and benefit of the parties hereto. No other person or entity shall have any right of
12 action based upon the provisions of this Agreement.

13 **SECTION 11. Indemnification.** Except as to any legal challenge or claim brought by any
14 person or entity questioning the use of redevelopment funds for the purposes set forth herein that is the
15 subject of this Agreement: (i) RCTD shall indemnify and hold Agency, its officers, agents and
16 employees free and harmless from liability to any person or entity not a party to this Agreement from
17 any damage, loss or injury to person and/or property which primarily relates to or arises from the
18 negligence or willful misconduct of the RCTD, its officers, agents, or employees in the execution or
19 implementation of this Agreement; (ii) Agency shall indemnify and hold RCTD, its officers, agents, or
20 employees free and harmless from any person or entity not a party to this Agreement from any damage,
21 loss or injury to person and/ or property which primarily relates to or arises from the negligence or
22 willful misconduct of Agency, its officers, agents, or employees in the execution or implementation of
23 this Agreement.

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1 **SECTION 12. Section Headings.** The Section headings herein are for the convenience of the
2 parties only and shall not be deemed to govern, limit, modify or in any manner affect the scope,
3 meaning or intent of the provisions or language of this Agreement.

4 **SECTION 13. Time Limit.** RCTD shall complete the work that is the subject of this
5 Agreement within a period of forty-eight (48) months after the date of execution of this Agreement. In
6 the event said forty-eight (48) month period expires prior to the completion of the work, the terms of
7 this Agreement may be extended upon written consent of both parties. Nothing in this Section shall be
8 deemed a waiver of any or all claims or other actions by either party in regard to any breach of this
9 Agreement.

10 **SECTION 14. Compliance with Laws and Regulations.** By executing this Agreement,
11 Agency and RCTD agree to comply with all applicable federal, state and local laws, regulations and
12 ordinances.

13 **SECTION 15. Assignment and Modification.** This Agreement shall not be assigned,
14 amended or modified without prior written approval of the Agency and RCTD.

15 **SECTION 16. Waiver.** Failure by a party to insist upon the strict performance of any of the
16 provisions of this Agreement by the other party, or the failure by a party to exercise its rights upon the
17 default of the other party, shall not constitute a waiver of such party's right to insist and demand strict
18 compliance by the other party with the terms of this Agreement thereafter.

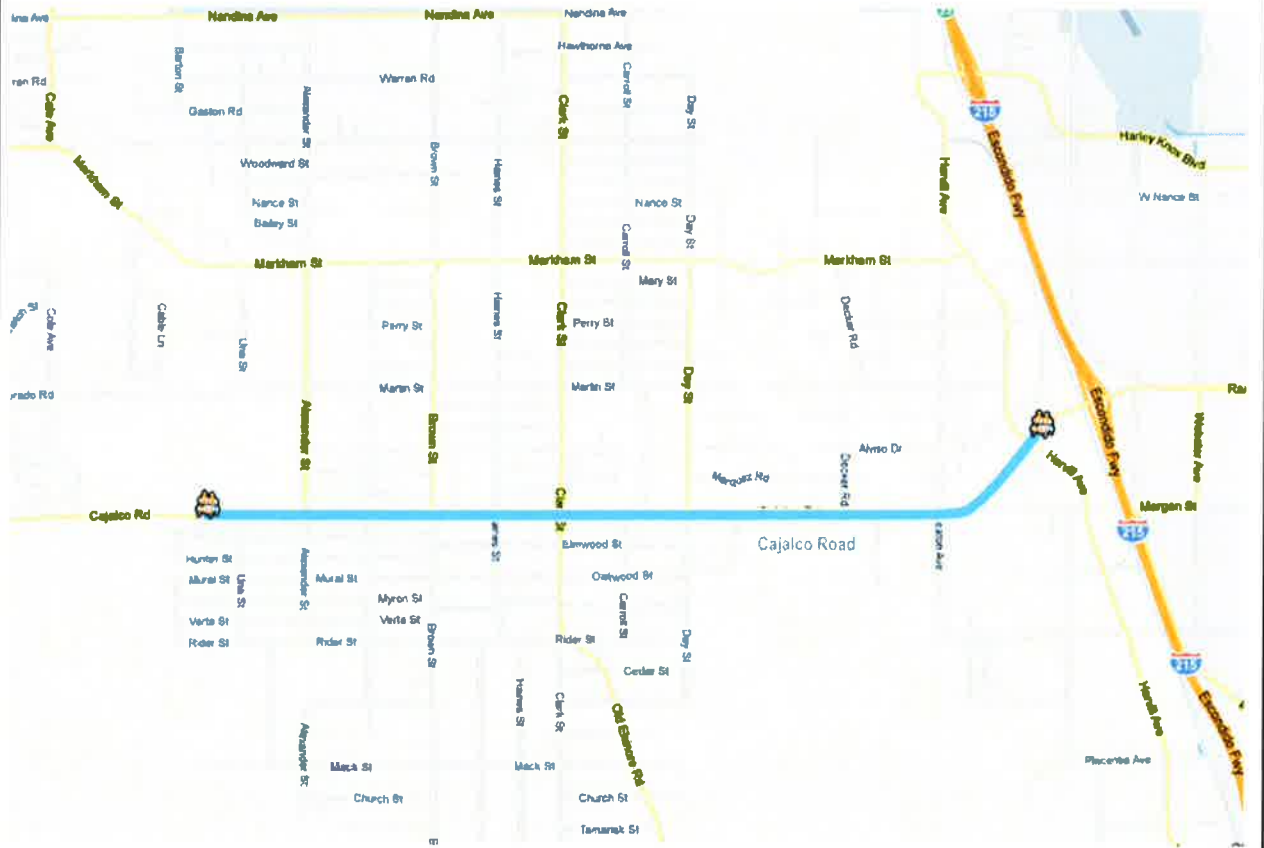
19 **SECTION 17. Severability.** Each paragraph and provision of this Agreement is severable
20 from each provision, and if any provision or part thereof is declared invalid, the remaining provisions
21 shall remain in full force and effect.

22 **SECTION 18. Authority to Execute.** The persons executing this Agreement or exhibits
23 attached hereto on behalf of the parties to this Agreement hereby warrant and represent that they have
24 the authority to execute this Agreement and warrant and represent that they have the authority to bind
25 the respective parties to this Agreement to the performance of its obligations hereunder.
