- 18 • The Cove is a family-friendly facility. Inappropriate behavior, language or attire
19 are not permitted and will be grounds for refusing admission or removal from
20 The Cove without a refund.
- 21 • The Cove is a drug and tobacco free park. Drug and tobacco items are not
22 permitted in or around the park.
- 23 • The Cove is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Guests are encouraged to use
24 on-site lockers to store personal items.
- 25 • For guest protection, use of recording devices (cameras, video cameras & cell
26 phones) is strictly prohibited in locker room areas and restrooms.
- 27 • Rides and attractions are scheduled to close 15 minutes prior to The Cove park
28 closing time.

29 **Dress Code:**

- 30 • Traditional swimwear is required. Provocative attire, street clothes, cut-offs, and
31 clothing with rivets, snaps, buttons, belts, or metal ornamentation are not
32 permitted.
- 33 • Swim diapers (disposable swim diapers or plastic pants) are required for all

- 35 • Outside flotation devices (water wings, life vests, inflatable tubes, etc.) are not
36 permitted. Life jackets and inflatable tubes are available at no cost inside The
37 Cove.
- 38 • Snorkels, goggles and/or fins are not permitted.
- 39 • Guests are encouraged to wear water shoes while walking around The Cove
40 grounds and in the Ne'er Endin' River. Shoes are not permitted to be worn on
41 any slides or other attractions.

42 **Health & Safety:**

- 43 • All guests must shower before entering the water.
- 44 • Guests that have experienced stomach and/or intestinal illness within the past two
45 weeks should not enter the water.
- 46 • Guests with open wounds or bandages are not permitted to enter the water.

- Guests are required to wash their hands after using the restroom and/or after changing a diaper. Diaper changing on or around the pool deck is not permitted.
- Do not drink the water from any pools or attractions. Drinking fountains are available for water consumption.
- The Cove/Jurupa Aquatic Center staff shall have the final authority in all matters concerning the safety of the park and park guests.

SUBJECT: Resolution 2011-4, Amendment to resolution 2010-1 revising Use Fees for the Riverside County Regional Park & Open-Space District effective March 1, 2011

BACKGROUND:

On May 25, 2010, by Minute Order 13.1, your honorable Board approved Resolution 2010-1, establishing Use Fees for the District effective July 1, 2010. The proposed amendment to Resolution 2010-1 is to establish fees for the following reasons:

1. To amend the fees for the Jurupa Aquatic Center. An Aquatic Business Plan was created to develop a defined fee structure and related services to be offered. This information was not available during the previous Board action; and
2. To establish a new fee for the Rancho Jurupa Park cabins. These cabins were constructed as part of new park improvements and will be a significant upgrade. The new fees will cover the maintenance costs associated with this new amenity.

Fees revised and established now will allow the District to recover expenditures in the current fiscal year rather than waiting until the cyclical fee update effective July 1st of each year.

The changes incorporated into Resolution 2011-4 have been reviewed and approved by the District Advisory Commission at its meeting on January 6, 2011. It is requested that your Honorable Board approve said changes and adopt Resolution 2011-4, amending Resolution 2010-1 revising Use Fees for the District, effective March 1, 2011.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Riverside County Regional Park & Open-Space District, in regular session assembled on February 15, 2011, that Exhibit A of Resolution 2010-1 is hereby amended in the following particulars and no others:

- Subsection G of Section I "General Recreation Fees" is amended to add the following line item immediately following "Special Events":
"Cabins (2-day minimum) \$80 per day"
- Subsection M of Section I "General Recreation Fees" is amended to delete line items for "Private parties", "Competition Pool", and "Water Park" and is hereby replaced with the following:
"Private parties Refer to Section III
Competition Pool Refer to Section III
Water Park Refer to Section III"
- Subsection P of Section I "General Recreation Fees" is hereby amended to add the following language:
"Jurupa Aquatic Center - See full range of fees under Section III, subsection K, Specific Recreation Areas"
- Subsection B of Section III, "Specific Recreation Areas" is amended to include the following line item immediately following "Special Events":
"Cabins:
Rental fee (2-day minimum) \$ 80

Cleaning and security deposit \$300
