**SUBJECT:** Adoption of Resolution #2011-024 Authorizing the Sheriff's Department to Submit a Grant Application to the California Department of Parks and Recreation

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** Move that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution #2011-024, which authorizes the Sheriff to sign and submit a grant application to the California Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Recreation for \$173,400 to continue off-highway vehicle (OHV) law enforcement efforts in Riverside County and expand enforcement by targeting sites in the unincorporated areas of all five Supervisorial Districts.

**BACKGROUND:** The California Department of Parks and Recreation is currently accepting grant applications for its Off-Highway Vehicle Enforcement Program. On September 10, 2002 (3.32), the Board approved two Project Agreements with the Department for a County off-highway motor vehicle enforcement program. Christened the Riverside Off-Highway Vehicle Enforcement Program (R.O.V.E.), this innovative and effective program has put Deputies on all-terrain vehicles (ATVs) to enforce laws concerning illegal off-highway driving, dumping, driving under the influence and environmental destruction.

The Board accepted grant funds and approved project grant agreements to continue this effort for the following years: April 27, 2004 (3.18), July 12, 2005 (3.58), October 2, 2007 (3.57), March 11, 2008 (3.45), March 24, 2009 (3.18) and February 23, 2010 (3.48).

The current application will begin Phase VII of the Sheriff's county-wide effort by expanding enforcement efforts in all five Supervisorial Districts with a proposed start date of September 2011. The application requests \$173,400 to support Deputy Sheriff overtime for continued and expanded patrols in problematic areas.

The grant application requires a 25% match of the total project cost of \$231,200 in the amount of \$57,800. The Department proposes contributing an in-kind match of Special Enforcement Bureau salaries. All local match contributions will come from the Department's status quo budget. Any grant awarded will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for review and approval.

During the development of this phase of the county-wide project, the Sheriff requested public comment via a posting on the Department's web site and through mailings to interested individuals.


8 WHEREAS, The people of the State of California have enacted the Off-Highway
