The voters in Riverside County have consistently signaled the critical importance of improving SR-91 by including this corridor in the original Measure A and Measure A extension funding plans for designated use of the ½ cent sales tax that goes toward transportation. Over 270,000 Vehicles per day use the most congested

segments of SR-91 in Riverside County. This \$1.3 billion project would be the largest construction project in Riverside County, and one of the largest in the Nation.

In addition to the enormous public benefits realized by the projected 23 minute average saving in peak-hour commute, this project will help reduce "cut-through" traffic impact from commuters that use local roads to by-pass congestion on SR-91. The SR-91 is also recognized as an absolutely critical corridor for emergency access and response to and from the Inland Empire to the South Los Angeles and Orange County areas. This project is also projected to create 1,800 annual jobs between its start and 2015.

The Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) is seeking a loan through the Transportation Infrastructure Innovation and Finance Act (TIFIA) to supplement the substantial financial contribution made by the residents of Riverside County and help to fully fund this critical project.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE SUPPORTING CONSTRUCTION OF STATE ROUTE 91 CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

WHEREAS, Riverside County will be home to one of the largest highway construction projects to commence in the State of California in nearly a decade, and one of the largest in the nation;

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside has been a consistent partner with the Riverside County Transportation Commission in improving the State Route 91 Corridor;

WHEREAS, the residents and businesses of Riverside County are severely impacted by the congestion on State Route 91, including but not limited to, "cut-through traffic," travel time delays to reach their families, employment, customers, recreational activities, and reduced air quality;

WHEREAS, the average daily peak-hour commuter is estimated save 22.6 minutes round-trip as a result of the construction of the State Route 91 Corridor Improvement Project;

WHEREAS, traffic on State Route 91 directly contributes to severe congestion on other freeways in Riverside County such as I-15, I-10, SR-71, SR-60 and I-215;

WHEREAS, studies demonstrate that significant economic growth will accrue to Riverside County as a result of the State Route 91 Corridor Improvement Project, including but not limited to, \$9.3 million in additional state and local government revenues, a permanent 2% increase in sales tax revenues, and 1,800 added jobs per year in Riverside County between now and 2015;

WHEREAS, State Route 91 is absolutely critical for emergency access and response to the Inland Empire to/from the South Los Angeles and Orange County areas;

WHEREAS, the positive benefits of the State Route 91 Corridor Improvement Project will significantly improve the "livability" of Riverside County and the surrounding region;

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Integrated Project (RCIP), Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (MSHCP), and Community Environmental Transportation Acceptability Process (CETAP), are all national examples of comprehensive planning and partnership with federal agencies to enable the
