SUBJECT: County Historic Landmark Designation—District I

HISTORICAL INFORMATION: The station was built by the California Southern Railway Co. in 1896. Located at Graham Avenue and Spring Street, it was heavily used by passengers and for freight shipments of agricultural products. The building is cross gabled with a hip roofed bay window. It held a comfortable waiting room and had large freight platform. Telegraph equipment was located in the bay.

The station was the heartbeat of the town and remains so today as the Chamber of Commerce occupies the building and uses it for their offices.
