3. Direct the Clerk of the Board to file a Notice of Exemption with the County Clerk for posting.

BACKGROUND: Ordinance No. 348.4706 is a proposal to amend Article X, section 10.1, the Industrial Park (I-P) zone, to include provisions for the inclusion of Emergency Shelters. Ordinance No. 348.4706 also amends section 10.4 to include development standards for Emergency Shelters. Government Code Section 65582 requires local governments to identify a zone or zones where emergency shelters are allowed as a permitted use without a conditional use or other discretionary permit. An emergency shelter is defined as housing with minimal supportive services for homeless persons that is limited to occupancy of six months or less by a homeless person and where no individual or household may be denied emergency shelter because of an inability to pay (Government Code 65582 and Health and Safety Code 50801).

Ordinance No. 348.4706 was initiated by the Board of Supervisors on July 13, 2010.

The Planning Commission previously recommended Ordinance No. 348.4706 for adoption by the Board of Supervisors based upon the findings and conclusions in the Planning Department Staff Report attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

ORDINANCE NO. 348.4706

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 348 RELATING TO ZONING

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside ordains as follows:

Section 1. A new subsection a. of Section 10.1 of Ordinance No. 348 is added to read as follows:

- "a. The following uses shall be permitted in the I-P Zone:
 - (1) Emergency shelters."
- Section 2. Existing subsections a., b., c., and d. of Section 10.1 of Ordinance No. 348 are relettered b., c., d., and e. respectively.
 - Section 3. Subsection e. of Section 10.1 of Ordinance No. 348 is amended to read as follows:
 - "e. Any use that is not specifically listed in Subsections b. and c. may be considered a permitted or conditionally permitted use provided that the Planning Director finds that the proposed use is substantially the same in character and intensity as those listed in the designated subsections. Such a use is subject to the permit process which governs the category in which it falls."
 - Section 4. A new subsection o. of Section 10.4 of Ordinance No. 348 is added to read as follows:
 - "o. EMERGENCY SHELTERS. In addition to all other development standards of the I-P Zone, the following development standards shall apply to emergency shelters:
 - (1) For purposes of this section, the term "client" shall mean a homeless person who uses the facilities of an emergency shelter to eat, shower or sleep but is not a staff member.
 - (2) A minimum of 125 square feet of floor area shall be provided for each client served (eating, showering or sleeping) at any one time. One bed shall be provided for each client sleeping at the emergency shelter.

- (3) The minimum interior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 14 or fewer beds shall be 125 square feet. The minimum interior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 15 or more beds shall be 200 square feet.
- (4) The minimum exterior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 14 or fewer beds shall be 450 square feet. The minimum exterior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 15 or more beds shall be 900 square feet.
- (5) The following off-street parking shall be provided: one space each for the maximum number of employees who will be present on the site at the same time and one space for each six client beds in the shelter, rounded up to the nearest whole number.
- (6) Outdoor lighting shall be provided in all parking areas, exterior waiting and client intake areas, and outdoor common areas.
- (7) If the emergency shelter accommodates both men and women, separate sleeping, lavatory and bathing areas shall be provided for men and for women.
- (8) An emergency shelter shall have a manager and at least one other staff member present on site during all hours of operation. If the emergency shelter accommodates both men and women, one employee, manager or staff member, of each sex shall be present during all hours of operation. The manager and all staff members shall be persons who maintain a separate residence.
- (9) No client shall be allowed to stay more than 300 total days within any 12 month period or more than 180 consecutive days.
- (10) No emergency shelter shall be located on a lot where any lot line of such lot is within 300 feet of any lot line of a lot where another emergency shelter is located.
- (11) No emergency shelter shall be located within 1,700 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport if the runway is less than 6,000 feet in length. No emergency shelter shall be located within 2,500

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feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport if the runway is 6,000 feet or more in length but less than 12,000 feet in length. No emergency shelter shall be located within 3,000 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport or a military airport if the runway is 12,000 feet or more in length.

(12) The maximum number of beds in an emergency shelter shall be 11 when the emergency shelter is located within 21,500 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport or located within 43,300 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a military airport. In all other instances, the maximum number of beds in an emergency shelter shall be 75."

Section 5. Existing subsection o. of Section 10.4 of Ordinance No. 348 is relettered p.
 Section 6. A new Section 21.32b. is added to Ordinance No. 348 to read as follows:
 "SECTION 21.32b. EMERGENCY SHELTER. Housing with minimal supportive services for homeless persons that is limited to occupancy of six months or less by a homeless person and where no individual or household may be denied emergency

shelter because of an inability to pay."

COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE PLANNING DEPARTMENT STAFF REPORT

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

Ordinance 348.4706 is a proposal to amend Article X, Section 10.1, the Industrial Park (I-P) zone to include provisions for the inclusion of Emergency Shelters. Government Code Section 65582 requires that a local government identify a zone or zones where emergency shelters are allowed as a permitted use without a conditional use or other discretionary permit. An emergency shelter is defined as housing with minimal supportive services for homeless persons that is limited to occupancy of six months or less by a homeless person and where no individual or household may be denied emergency shelter because of an inability to pay (Government Code 65582 and Health and Safety Code 50801).

The proposed ordinance amendment will provide for the inclusion of an emergency shelter in the Industrial Park (I-P) zone pursuant to the issuance of a building permit by the department of Building and Safety. Through the staff review process, the Industrial Park (I-P) zone was identified as the most appropriate zoning classification to provide for this use. This was based upon its ability to provide an adequate level of infrastructure in addition to providing the necessary level of protection from sensitive land uses.

BACKGROUND June 14, 2010

On October 15, 2007, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed into law Senate Bill (SB) 2, which amends Government Code Sections 65582, 65583, and 65589.5 of State Housing Element Law. This legislation requires local jurisdictions to strengthen provisions for addressing the housing needs of the homeless, including the identification a zone or zones where emergency shelters are allowed as a permitted use without a conditional use permit. This legislation took effect January 1, 2008 and applies to jurisdictions with housing elements due June 30, 2008 and after.

The update to the Riverside County Housing Element is underway and will include all necessary elements relative to Government Code Sections 65582, 65583, and 65589.5 applicable to the Housing Element provisions established by the State of California.

The Emergency Shelters Ordinance Amendment was initiated by the Board of Supervisors on July 13, 2010.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

TENTATIVE APPROVAL of **ORDINANCE NO. 348.4706**, based upon the findings and conclusions incorporated in the staff report.

CONCLUSIONS:

1. The proposed ordinance amendment is in conformance with the Land Use Designations of the unincorporated areas of Riverside County and with all other elements of the Riverside County General Plan.

- 2. The proposed ordinance amendment is consistent with the zoning classification of Ordinance No. 348, and with all other applicable provisions of Ordinance No. 348
- 3. The public health, safety, and general welfare are protected through this ordinance amendment.
- 4. The public's health, safety, and general welfare are protected through project design.
- 5. The project will not have a significant effect onto the surrounding environment.

<u>FINDINGS</u>: The following findings are in addition to those incorporated in the summary of findings and in the attached environmental assessment, which is incorporated herein by reference.

- 1. The proposed amendment applies to all areas within the unincorporated area of Riverside County.
- 2. The Planning Department has found that Ordinance No. 348.4706 ("the project") is statutorily exempt from the provisions of CEQA based on CEQA Guidelines Section 15282, subsection (r), which states, "Determinations made regarding a city or county's regional housing needs as set forth in Section 65584 of the Government Code." On October 15, 2007, Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger signed into law SB 2, which amends Government Code Sections 65582, 65583, and 65589.5 of State Housing Element Law. This legislation requires local jurisdictions to strengthen provisions for addressing the housing needs of the homeless, including the identification a zone or zones where emergency shelters are allowed as a permitted use without a conditional use permit. The project complies with the objectives set forth in the above-referenced Government Codes by amending County Ordinance No. 348 to include provisions for emergency shelters. Section 65584 requires the County implement its share of the regional housing needs as set forth in the Regional Housing Needs Plan (RHNP).

 - (4) The minimum exterior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 14 or fewer beds shall be 450 square feet. The minimum exterior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 15 or more beds shall be 900 square feet.
 - (5) The following off-street parking shall be provided: one space each for the maximum number of employees who will be present on the site at the same time and one space for each six client beds in the shelter, rounded up to the nearest whole number.

 - (7) If the emergency shelter accommodates both men and women, separate sleeping, lavatory and bathing areas shall be provided for men and for women.
 - (8) An emergency shelter shall have a manager and at least one other staff member present on site during all hours of operation. If the emergency shelter accommodates both men and women, one employee, manager

- or staff member, of each sex shall be present during all hours of operation. The manager and all staff members shall be persons who maintain a separate residence.
- (9) No client shall be allowed to stay more than 300 total days within any 12 month period or more than 180 consecutive days.
- (10) No emergency shelter shall be located on a lot where any lot line of such lot is within 300 feet of any lot line of a lot where another emergency shelter is located.
- (11) No emergency shelter shall be located within 1,700 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport if the runway is less than 6,000 feet in length. No emergency shelter shall be located within 2,500 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport if the runway is 6,000 feet or more in length but less than 12,000 feet in length. No emergency shelter shall be located within 3,000 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport or a military airport if the runway is 12,000 feet or more in length.

Section 3. Subsection e, of Section 10.1 of Ordinance No. 348 is amended to read as follows:
"e, Any use that is not specifically listed in Subsections b, and c, may be considered a permitted or conditionally permitted use provided that the Planning Director finds that the proposed use is substantially the same in character and intensity as those listed in the designated subsections. Such a use is subject to the permit process which governs the category in which it falls."

Section 4. A new subsection of Section 10.4 of Ordinance No. 348 is added to read as follows:

"O. EMERGENCY SHELTERS. In addition to all other development standards of the I-P. Zone, the following development standards of the I-P. Zone, the following development standards shall apply to emergency shelters:

(1) For purposes of this section, the term "client" shall mean a homeless person who uses the facilities of an emergency shelter to eat, shower or sleep but is not a staff member.

(2) A minimum of 125 square feet of floor area shall be provided for each client served (eating, showering or sleeping) at any one time. One bed shall be provided for each client sleeping at the emergency shelter.

(3) The minimum interior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 14 or fewer beds shall be 125 square feet. The minimum interior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 15 or more beds shall be 200 square feet.

(4) The minimum exterior waiting and client intake area for a shelter with 15 or more beds shall be 200 square feet.

(5) The following off-street parking shall be provided on espace each for the maximum number of employees who will be present on the site at the same time and one space for each six client beds in the shelter, rounded up to the nearest whole number.

(6) Outdoor lighting shall be provided in all parking areas, exterior waiting and client intake areas, and outdoor common areas.

(7) If the emergency shelter shall have a manager and at least one other staff member present on site during all hours of operation. If the emergency shelter shall be located on a lot where any lot line of such lot is within 300 feet of any lot line of a runway of a public-use airport if the runway is each shall be located within 1,700 feet of any point on the centerline of a runway of a public-use airport or the centerli

Section 5. Existing subsection o. of Section 10.4 of Ordinance No. 348 is relettered p.

Section 6. A new Section 21.32b. is added to Ordinance No. 348 to read as follows:
"SECTION 21.32b. EMERGENCY SHELTER. Housing with minimal supportive services for homeless persons that is limited to occupancy of six months or less by a homeless person and where no individual or household may be denied emergency shelter because of an inability to pay."

Section 7. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.
