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BACKGROUND:

According to the 2005 California Health Interview Survey, the prevalence of diabetes among adults in Riverside County is approximately 9% or 116,000 people. Three of every five individuals with diabetes experience one or more serious health complications from the disease, such as stroke or heart disease.

With this grant funding RCRMC will continue addressing the issue of cardiovascular complications in adult diabetic patients. Research has shown that significant reductions in cardiac and cerebrovascular events can be achieved if high risk diabetic patients take appropriate medications. RCRMC will enroll 300 new clinic patients in the A-L-L program, provide annual foot and retinal exams in at least 90% of the A-L-L patients, and ensure a minimum of 50% of the A-L-L patients have one record self-management goal. Outcome measures will be used to track patient progress in achieving the clinical objectives of the project.

FINANCIAL DATA:

RCRMC will receive the \$95,000 grant award in one payment.
