
**SUBJECT:** Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District Request to Decrease Number of Trustees

**RECOMMENDED MOTION:** that the Board of Supervisors decrease the number of Trustees appointed to the District by the County of Riverside from two to only one member.

**BACKGROUND:** Currently, the Board of Trustees of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District has two representatives appointed by the County of Riverside. George Read serves as the County appointed Trustee to the District. The other County Trustee appointment is vacant.

The District adopted the attached resolution requesting the Board of Supervisors to reduce the number of Trustees appointed to the District by the County to only one member. The District has requested this reduction because a portion of the County within the District boundaries incorporated into the City of Eastvale and Eastvale has appointed a Trustee to the Board to represent the City.

Health and Safety Code section 2015, subdivision (c) provides that within 60 days of receiving a resolution from the Board of Trustees to decrease the number of members, the Board of Supervisors shall order the decrease, consistent with the Board of Trustees' resolution.

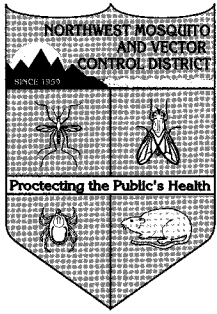

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**A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF  
THE NORTHWEST MOSQUITO AND VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT  
REQUESTING THE RIVERSIDE COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO  
REDUCE THE NUMBER OF ITS REPRESENTATIVES ON THE  
BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

**WHEREAS**, the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District (“District”) is a California special district, organized and exercising governmental powers pursuant to the California Mosquito Abatement and Vector Control District Law (California Health & Safety Code Section 2000, et seq.); and

**WHEREAS**, the District’s boundaries are located within Riverside County, California (“County”), and contain both incorporated and unincorporated territory; and

**WHEREAS**, the District’s Board of Trustees is constituted of members appointed by the County Board of Supervisors and by the city councils of the cities within the District’s boundaries; and

**WHEREAS**, currently, there are two members appointed to the Board of Trustees by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, recently, one new city has incorporated within the District’s boundaries and the City of Canyon Lake has also joined the District; and

**WHEREAS**, in order to more efficiently manage the District’s affairs, the Board of Trustees desires to reduce by one the number of Board members appointed by the County Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Health & Safety Code Section 2025(b), the board of trustees of a mosquito abatement and vector control district may adopt a resolution requesting the board of supervisors of a county that contains territory within the District to increase or decrease the number of the members on the district’s board of trustees who represent the unincorporated territory of that county.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees of the Northwest Mosquito and Vector Control District that;

1. The above Recitals are all true and correct.
2. In accordance with Health & Safety Code Section 2025(b), the Board of Trustees, after thorough review, has determined that, for reasons of efficiency, it is desirable to reduce the number of members on the Board of Trustees representing the unincorporated County territory from two to one.
