

SUBJECT: Proclaim May 2011 as National Drug Court Month in Riverside County

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors Proclaim May 2011 as National Drug Court Month in Riverside County.

BACKGROUND: On April 28, 2009, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors approved the Form 11 to proclaim May 2009 as National Drug Court Month for Riverside County. Since the establishment of the first Riverside County Drug Court in 1995, the County has offered the Drug Court program and aftercare as an alternative to incarceration for qualified drug abuse offenders. The Riverside County Drug Courts enable communities to offer a successful and cost effective

SUBJECT: Proclaim May 2011 as National Drug Court Month in Riverside County

BACKGROUND: (continued)

In Riverside County, the Drug Court sites are located in Cathedral City, Blythe, Hemet and Riverside. Like many of the over 2,424 drug courts in operation nationally, the Drug Courts in Riverside County hear cases of offenders that are charged with drug-related crimes. The Drug Court relieves the already overwhelmed Court dockets, placing offenders in an environment where they undergo treatment and counseling, submit to frequent and random drug testing, make regular appearances before the Judge, and are monitored closely for program compliance.

This campaign is designed to promote the values of healthy drug-free living. Drug Court Month provides Riverside County and the Nation with a framework in which visible support is built for a drug free society. Riverside County Drug Courts have proven that drug usage by offenders is substantially reduced when they are enrolled in Drug Court programs. Therefore, the Department of Mental Health requests that the Board of Supervisors proclaim the Month of May as National Drug Court Month in Riverside County.

PROCLAMATION In Support of May, 2011 as "National Drug Court Month"

WHEREAS, The Riverside County Board of Supervisors and the Riverside County Department of Mental Health recognize the important contributions of the Riverside County Drug Courts which are proven to be an excellent way to make strides in winning the war against drugs; and

WHEREAS, Drug Courts provide the focus and leadership for community-wide, anti-drug systems, bringing together criminal justice, treatment, education and other community partners in the fight against drug abuse and criminality; and

WHEREAS, Drug Court programs combine intensive judicial supervision, mandatory substance abuse treatment and drug testing and escalating sanctions and incentives in order to break the cycle of drug addiction and its concomitant crime; and

WHEREAS, the judges, prosecutors, defense attorneys, treatment and rehabilitation professionals, law enforcement and corrections personnel, researchers and educators, national and community leaders and others dedicated to the movement have had a profound impact through hard work and commitment to their communities; and

WHEREAS, the Drug Court movement has grown nationally, from the 12 original Drug Courts in 1994 to over 2,424 Drug Courts that are in operation or in the planning stages; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County declares that a National Drug Court Month be proclaimed during the Month of May, 2011, recognizing the practitioners and participants who make Drug Courts work and the significant contributions that Drug Courts have made, and continue to make, in reducing drug usage and crime.
