SUBJECT: Development of New Small Water System Ordinance

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the initiation of a new ordinance to govern the operation of small drinking water systems; and
- 2) Direct the Department of Environmental Health to prepare and process the ordinance.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Department of Environmental Health has been delegated authority to regulate the operation and maintenance of small drinking water systems that supply water to between 5 and 15 homes. As the State regulations are somewhat lacking in detail, this proposed ordinance would provide further direction as well as the enforcement tools to help ensure that residents receive the highest quality drinking water possible.
