WHEREAS, Riverside County received designation as a community action agency in 1979, the Board of Supervisors and its tripartite Community Action Commission comprised in accordance with the law, one-third public sector, one-third private sector, and one-third low-income sector, are committed to ending poverty and developing innovative strategies for helping people, changing lives; and

WHEREAS, Community Action Partnership of Riverside County has been a leader to 1,200 peer agencies in the vision and the goal of ending poverty in America and in Riverside County, also known as "Bliss County", the desired state within the next 30 years; and

WHEREAS, Community Action Partnership of Riverside County was awarded the National Community Action Partnership Award for Excellence in 2005, becoming the first and so far the only public agency and California agency to receive this award; and
