The Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Program is funded through the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), National Institute of Justice (NIJ). Funds may be used to improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and medical examiner services including those provided by laboratories operated by States and units of local government; to eliminate a backlog in the analysis of forensic science evidence; to train, assist and employ laboratory personnel to eliminate such backlog.

The Coroner's office is proposing to use grant funds to purchase a freezer and a Digital Dental Imaging System (Dexis). These two items will enable them to expedite their processing time in determining the cause of death for the various cases which they have on file. The freezer will be used to maintain a special form of tissue which is used to help identify the cause of death in Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS) victims. The Dexis machine will be used to secure postmortem dental images for identification purposes.

Law Enforcement, legal representatives, and families of the victims all depend on the Coroner's office for evidence analysis. Decreasing the processing time allows the Coroner's office to render the desired information in a timely manner to all concerned parties.

The awarded grant will be brought to the Board for acceptance.

**CERTIFICATIONS REGARDING LOBBYING; DEBARMENT,  
SUSPENSION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS  
AND  
DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS**

Applicants should refer to the regulations cited below to determine the certification to which they are required to attest. - (f) Taking one of the following actions, within 30 calendar days of receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2), with respect to any employee who is so convicted
- (1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or
  - (2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a Federal, State, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency;
- (g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).
