SUBJECT: Transfer of DNA Identification Funds to the Sheriff's Department

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustments on the attached Schedule A to transfer DNA identification funds to the Sheriff's Department.

BACKGROUND: On November 2, 2004, the California electorate passed Proposition 69, which became law on November 3, 2004. The intent was to clarify existing law and to enable the state's DNA and Forensic Identification Database and Data Bank Program to become a more effective law enforcement tool.

In general, Proposition 69, as made law in Penal Code Sections 296 (a) and 298, requires law enforcement or custodial agencies, statewide, to collect buccal swab samples, right thumbprints, and a full palm print impression of each hand, and any blood specimens or other biological samples collected from felony arrestees be forwarded promptly to the Department of Justice for law enforcement identification analysis and entry into the Department of Justice DNA Database.

Section 76104.6 of the California Government Code establishes a county DNA Identification Fund for reimbursement of expenditures and administrative costs incurred by the local sheriff or other law enforcement agencies in compliance with PC Section 298. An additional dollar for every ten dollars or part thereof is collected in every county for all criminal offenses to bank this fund.

The Sheriff's Department requests that the Board approve a County Executive Office transfer from the County's DNA Identification Fund, in the amount of \$1,591,936 to reimburse the Department for the cost to collect the biological samples from an estimated 26,730 felony booking detainees who will enter the County detention facilities during FY 2010-11. Please note that staff's cost estimate is based on data for the period from July 1 2010 through December 31 2010, which has been projected through the end of the fiscal year.

Methodology

There are four job classifications in the Sheriff's Department responsible for DNA collection: Senior Correctional Corporal, Senior Correctional Deputy, Correctional Corporal, and Correctional Deputy. Calculated cost is based on the percentage of the identified custody staff involvement with the DNA collection procedures. The following summarize the DNA collection cost for FY 2010-11:

The Sheriff's Department also requests reimbursement in the amount of \$89,071 for the Coroner's cost to collect DNA samples for the period encompassing FY 2009-10 and July 2010 through March 2011. A table detailing the case type, amount of cases and the associated expense is included below.

The Sheriff's Department has already programmed FY 2010-11 interfund reimbursements of \$523,000 and \$33,000 for Sheriff's Corrections and the Coroner's Bureau, respectively. So, the Department requests the remaining amount of \$1,125,007 as a budget adjustment, and the Schedule A details a \$1,068,936 budget adjustment for Sheriff's Corrections and a \$56,071 adjustment for the Coroner's Bureau.
