SUBJECT: Resolution of the Board of Supervisors in support of California Highway Patrol's Motorcycle Safety Corridor Project on State Route 74 (SR-74).

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors join me in adopting Resolution No. 2011-151 in support of the Motorcycle Safety Corridor Project on State Route 74 (SR-74).

BACKGROUND: The California Highway Patrol (CHP), whose primary responsibility is patrolling state roadways, has found that a multi-disciplinary corridor safety task force is a dynamic way of improving traffic safety, both in the short- and long-term. Task forces comprised of representatives from local, regional, county, state, and federal government agencies, and from the private sector, are convened for each corridor. The mission of each task force is to assess a traffic corridor, make recommendations to improve traffic safety on that corridor, and implement as many recommendations as possible. To combat the dramatic increase in motorcycle-involved fatal and injury collisions, the Department has identified the "corridor approach" as a focused effort proven effective and reliable in decreasing traffic collision fatal and injured victims.

Corridor Description: SR-74 is mostly a two-lane winding mountain highway that opens up to four lanes, and returns to two lanes. SR-74 traverses the Ortega Mountain Range and provides direct access between southern Riverside County and southern Orange County.
