**BACKGROUND:** Landscaping and Lighting Maintenance District No. 89-1-Consolidated (District) maintains and services 163 locations throughout Riverside County. The District contains 71 separate zones of benefits and 65 street lighting zones of benefits as described in Attachment A. The annual budget for fiscal year 2011-12 totals \$2,052,128.

Consistent with the Board's direction regarding compliance with Article XIID of the California Constitution and the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972, the attached resolutions have been prepared and a public hearing scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on July 12, 2011 to receive testimony for and against the proposed assessments.
