from custody, conservatorships or in any other matter as provided by law. The court does not direct the county to pay any matters considered pursuant to civil procedures. Prior to FY 09/10 the Superior Court of Riverside County paid reporters for these transcripts. Beginning in August 2009 the county began making payments retroactive to invoices submitted beginning on July 1, 2009. The additional funding to be added to the FY 10/11 Court Transcript budget came from unspent pretrial services and was returned to the County by the Superior Court.
