ACCEPTANCE OF HIDTA GRANT PROGRAM FUNDS FOR MUTLTIPLE COUNTY INITIATIVES (RMTF, INCH & INCA) BR 11-089 Page 2

BACKGROUND: The U.S. Office of National Drug Control Policy (ONDCP) has notified the Riverside County Sheriff's Department that it has been allocated HIDTA Program funds for this year. The proposed grant award period will be from January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2012. County Counsel has approved the award documents as to form.

For over nineteen years, Riverside County has participated in the HIDTA program, which fosters cooperation among law enforcement agencies in their efforts to eliminate drug trafficking locally and nationally. The LA-HIDTA is comprised of the Los Angeles, Orange, Riverside, and San Bernardino counties. The Office of National Drug Control Policy and LA-HIDTA have confirmed that Riverside County's allocation for this grant award cycle is \$1,408,405.

Based on this award, grant funds will be distributed among the County project initiatives in the following manner:

Regional Methamphetamine Task Force (RMTF) \$395,843 Inland Narcotics Clearing House (INCH) \$533,786 Inland Crackdown Allied Task Force (INCA) \$478,776

No County match is required.

Operating with a focus throughout the entire LA-HIDTA region, the primary mission of the RMTF is to target major methamphetamine production, distribution, and Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTO) by investigating, disrupting, and arresting person(s) and organizations involved in illicit sales and trafficking of methamphetamine thereby improving the quality of life for all citizens, both regionally and nationally.

Statistics indicate that methamphetamine availability remains a constant concern and narcotic traffickers typically use well-established highways and pipelines to smuggle, ship and move methamphetamine and other illicit narcotics. In an effort to combat the availability of these narcotics, RMTF, using grant funds, will continue the deployment of highway interdiction teams, comprised of three narcotics detecting canines and their respective handlers. These teams will be used to identify, disrupt, and arrest DTOs that regularly use these highways and trafficking routes to further their criminal enterprise(s).

INCH will also aid the task forces by providing connectivity to the Statewide Integrated Narcotics Systems (SINS). Additionally, INCH will assist by providing necessary case support and serve as a clearing house for the dissemination of narcotics related intelligence.

INCH funds 50% of a Sheriff's Network Administrator. Also, as initiated in FY 10-11, Riverside County will continue to use INCH grant funds to pay for Intelligence Analysts in FY 2011-12. The County will also continue to purchase the service of the Intelligence Analysts from a personnel recruiting agency, Strategic Contracting Services (SCS).

Utilization of SCS as a single source provider of this service (as approved by the Board on 5/4/10 3.70) provides the County maximum flexibility for the deployment of these grant funded positions during this period when we also have determined that the hiring of permanent positions must be curtailed. The Sheriff's Department receives trained analysts whose services can be discontinued at the term of grant funding.

INCA, established in 1996, will support the efforts of the State Bureau of Narcotic Enforcement (BNE) in enforcing the controlled substance laws of California. The INCA task force is comprised of numerous law enforcement agencies within the jurisdiction of the LA-HIDTA. This cooperative effort, coupled with their ability to jointly work with similar Crackdown Task Forces, has proven to be highly effective in the investigation of DTOs within the region. Investigative overtime for the participating agencies is budgeted at \$333,375 through INCA funding.

The grant will also continue to provide funding for an accounting staff position at the Sheriff's Special Investigations Bureau, which the Department has filled at the Accounting Technician I (AT I) level.

Per the procedure enunciated in two Sheriff's Form 11 and approved by the Board on 2/1/11 3.16 and 3/15/11 3.40, the Board should note that the State Department of Justice, the Riverside and San Bernardino Police Departments will participate on the HIDTA task force, and the Sheriff's Department will reimburse them in excess of \$25,000 annually for service and equipment expenses and/or overtime hours logged during task force activities. By this notification, the Board exempts the Purchasing Agent from reporting these agencies as sole source project partners for the term of the grant project and authorizes the Purchasing Agent to contract with these partners in amounts approved by the HIDTA grant.

Finally, the Sheriff's Department is recommending that the Board approve the purchase of five Coleman Technologies' Titanium package vehicle trackers from Law Enforcement Associates (LEA), the California distributor and single source provider of Coleman products. The Sheriff's Special Investigations Unit has been using Coleman Technologies "Platinuim package" GPS trackers since 2005.

The Titanium package GPS tracker provides a number of new and unique features: it has maximum coverage within the United States and internationally; it will also allow for continuous uninterrupted monitoring if a vehicle with a tracker crosses the border into Mexico. Its GPS sensitivity will allow the device the capability to navigate in areas with obstructed views. It provides paging notification capabilities and it utilizes internal magnets to simplify vehicle installation.

Price Reasonableness: The Titanium Package cost is \$7,995 per package; LEA is offering the package at a cost of \$7,695, a \$300.00 discount, which is more than the GSA discount of 2%. With a \$135.00 storage case, the total package cost including tax and shipping is \$8,515.13. 5 packages x \$8,515.13 = \$42,575.65.

The below information is provided in support of my Department requesting approval for a sole source. Outside of a duly declared emergency, the time to develop a statement of work or specifications is not in itself justification for sole source.

- 1. Supply/Service being requested: Titanium All in One Vehicle Trackers
- 2. Supplier being requested: Law Enforcement Associates (LEA)
- 3. Alternative suppliers that can or might be able to provide supply/service:

Coleman Technologies, Inc. (manufacturer)

4. Extent of market search conducted:

Internet research was conducted.

5. Unique features of the supply/service being requested from this supplier, which no alternative supplier can provide:

LEA is the authorized California distributor for Coleman Technologies' AIO vehicle trackers. The Sheriff's Special Investigations Unit currently has older models of GPS tracking equipment purchased in 2005 and 2007 from LEA. This new GPS tracker provides maximum coverage within the United States and internationally; it has paging notification capabilities; is ultra-sensitive to allow the device the capability to navigate in areas with obstructed views; finally it utilizes internal magnets to simplify vehicle installation. It will also allow for continuous uninterupted monitoring if vehicles with trackers cross the border into Mexico.

6. Reasons why my department requires these unique features and what benefit will accrue to the county:

There are several undercover units that utilize surveillance equipment. The Sheriff's Department currently has a total of 13 All in One (Platinum) Trackers in the field being used in on-going multiple investigations for intelligence gathering on large scale drug cases.

The newer models and software are compatible with the older version. Staff familiarity with the older version of the All in One tracker, will enable us to utilize the Titanium trackers with little or no training for proper use and will allow the immediate implementation for current on-going investigations.

7. Price Reasonableness: The Titanium Package cost is \$7,995 per package; LEA is offering the package at a cost of \$7,695, a \$300.00 discount which is more than the GSA discount of 2%, plus a \$135.00 storage case cost, for a total cost including tax and shipping of \$8,515.13 each. 5 units + 5 cases = \$42,575.65 total costs.

In addition, with every Titanium Package purchase, LEA is adding the Platinum package tracker free of charge. So we gain 5 back-up trackers at no charge.

8. Does moving forward on this product or service further obligate the county to future similar contractual arrangements or any ongoing costs affiliated with this sole source? (Maintenance, support, or upgrades, if so, please explain). No.

A. General Provisions
