

BACKGROUND:

The Department of Environmental Health (the "Department") has been waiting several years for the State to pass regulations for the body art industry, which covers activities such as tattoo, body piercing and permanent cosmetics. Although state-wide regulation of the industry would appear to be the best approach, numerous attempts at passage of State regulations have failed, including, most recently, California Assembly Bill 223.

Accordingly, the Department desires to move forward with County Ordinance No. 907, which will establish minimum standards for body art facilities and practitioners engaged in the business of body art in Riverside County. Department staff have circulated the draft ordinance to interested practitioners including meeting with individual shop owners. Some changes were made to the ordinance to address concerns. These regulations are intended to protect both the practitioner and the client from transmission of contagious diseases through the application of proper body art procedures and the control of cross-contamination of instruments and supplies.

The approval of this ordinance amendment will result in no cost to the County; implementation expenses will be paid through fees.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 907

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE REGULATING BODY ART FACILITIES, PERMANENT COSMETICS AND BODY PIERCING FACILITIES

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 25124(b); a certified copy of the full text of Ordinance No. 907 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside located at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Ordinance No. 907 establishes minimum standards that apply to body art facilities, including temporary facilities, and practitioners of body art to help protect both the practitioner and the client from transmission of infectious diseases. Body art includes body piercing, branding, permanent cosmetics, and tattooing. The ordinance requires owners, operators, and practitioners to follow safe and healthy practices, including the use of sterilized equipment and the maintenance of a sterile work environment.

The major components of Ordinance No. 907 do the following:

Requires all owners and operators of body art facilities to obtain a permit through the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health (the "Department"), create a Department approved exposure control plan to manage and minimize exposure to blood-borne pathogens, allow inspections of the facility by Department representatives, require practitioner employees to attend a Department approved bloodborne pathogens exposure control training, and comply with requirements pertaining to the physical facility itself, equipment sterilization, and autoclave requirements (if an autoclave is used).

Requires all practitioners of body art to register with the Department, practice only in permitted body art facilities, and attend bloodborne pathogens exposure control training.

Sets forth the associated fees for permits, inspections, and practitioner registrations. It also contains the penalties for violations of the ordinance requirements, which include criminal infractions, misdemeanors, monetary administrative penalties, injunctive relief, abatement, and other civil remedies.

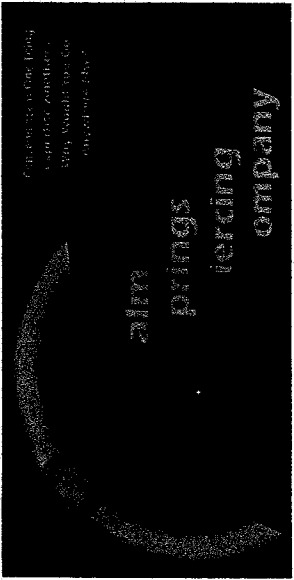
Provides for notice and due process related to the denial, suspension, or revocation of body art facility permits or practitioner registrations issued by the Department.

Prohibits registered sex offenders (as defined under California Penal Code Section 290) from owning or operating a body art facility or practicing body art as a registered practitioner. It also prohibits body art facilities from being located within 2500 feet of a school, park, or other location where minors congregate.

Any person affected by the above matter(s) may submit written comments to the Clerk of the Board before the hearing or may appear and be heard in support or opposition to the project at the time of the hearing. If you challenge the above item(s) in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence, to the Board of Supervisors at, or prior to, the public hearing.

Comments on Section 5, Definitions Subsection FF

We urge the adoption of Standard vs. Universal Precautions

■ Universal Precautions vs. Standard Precautions

- Universal Precautions include general recommendations when contact with blood or body secretions containing blood is anticipated
- Standard precautions apply to ALL CLIENTS and include specific requirements for (1) blood; (2) all body fluids, secretions, and excretions *except sweat*, regardless of whether or not they contain blood; (3) nonintact skin; and (4) mucous membranes.
- Standard Precautions require little, if any, increase in costs of business, mandate only tightening of processes and procedures, and provide substantially greater safety to the public, body art professionals, and employees.

PSPC – Comments

Proposed Ordinance 907

Section 8, Body Art Practitioners Responsibilities We urge tighter restrictions on metals and jewelry

- Metals and Jewelry

- Paragraph Q allows for AISI 316L, is an extra low carbon grade of 316, generally used in stainless steel watches and marine applications. Although widely used in substandard jewelry, this grade of metal does not meet the specifications of 316LVM which is surgical implant grade and should be the MINIMUM acceptable metal for newly pierced skin along with ASTM F136 6A4V Titanium, 14K and 18k gold alloys using palladium, and other materials with demonstrated bio-compatibility.
- This Section does not specify minimum jewelry characteristics and we strongly suggest wording used in other jurisdictions, such as, "Appropriate jewelry has no nicks, scratches, burrs, or irregular surfaces that might endanger tissue." Also, several jurisdictions have interpreted the above wording to mean that only internally threaded jewelry may be used in new piercings. (Bulloch County, Georgia; E.U. 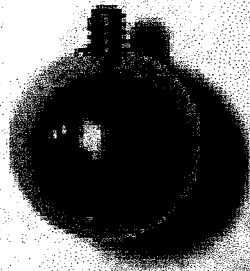

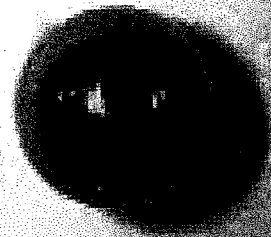

Section 5, Paragraph X We urge the elimination or strict control of the use of piercing guns

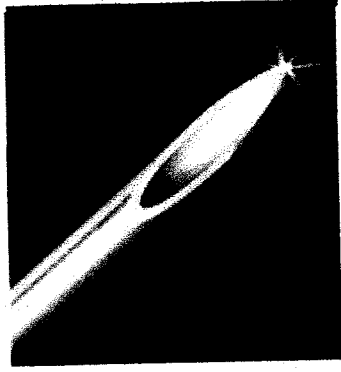
- Piercing Guns Vs. Professional Body Piercing Needles

Piercing Guns

- Cannot be sterilized in an autoclave – Potential source of contamination
- Poorly Trained/Untrained Operators
- General Tissue Trauma – Dangerous to Cartilage
- Use s/b Eliminated or Strictly Limited to Earlobes (and enforced).

Professional Body Piercing Needles

- Sterilized/Single use
- Surgically sharp
- In trained hands, can be used to safely pierce ear cartilage



PSPC - Comments

Proposed Ordinance 907

Section 7, Sterilization

- Our current process exceeds the guidelines in almost all areas
- **Concerns with the ordinance**
 - Section 7, Paragraph O requires annual autoclave certification but does not specify certification parameters, while Paragraph U, item ii. requires monthly commercial 3rd party monitoring of spore tests
 - If the autoclave passes the monthly spore tests, it is being maintained optimally and the annual certification is redundant.
 - Section 7, Paragraph U, item iii. requires a log of each sterilization cycle, load contents, date, and results. We sterilize hundreds of tools, components, and needles each week using a multiple-pass sterilization process. Recording the mass of data required by the item would require a full time employee - and is unnecessary in light of the temperature indicator strip on each piece of bagged, dated equipment. If the load is sterile, the packaging indicates so.

PSPC – Comments

Proposed Ordinance 907

Section 8, Body Art Practitioners Responsibilities

- **Concerns with the ordinance**
- Paragraph P. states "Only the Practitioner, authorized personnel, and Client are allowed in the procedure area when Body Art procedure is performed." This is unworkable. Clients often require support from family or friends and request their presence in the procedure area. This should be left to the discretion of the piercer and the client.
- Paragraph P. goes on to state that "When the procedure involves the genitalia, buttocks, or breast, an employee witness must be present to witness...."
 - **This constitutes and infringement on, and intrusion into, the privacy of the client - who should be the one charged with determining who is in the room besides the piercer.**
 - **The requirement itself indicates an unspoken and untrue bias against Body Art Professionals. The Livescan requirement in Section 7, Paragraph A, item ii, which we fully support, alleviates the need for such a requirement, which is both onerous in terms of cost and unnecessary in terms of character.**

PSPC - Comments on Proposed Ordinance 907

■ Concerns, Continued

- We feel that Section 7, Subsection vi. Limiting Body Art procedures to facilities located more than 2500 feet from a school or park is unduly restrictive, we suggest 500, or even 1000 feet.
 - In some planned communities, this restriction is tantamount to a code restriction disallowing our businesses.
- There is No Liability Insurance Requirement expressed in the document.
 - Every bar owner, Restaurateur, and Hair Salon in California must provide liability insurance and must prove it at some level: city, county, or state. Our industry provides for like possibility of liability and, yet, no agency requires insurance and few practitioners carry it.

PSPC – Final Comments on Proposed Ordinance 907

- We hope that our comments above inform and strengthen the Proposed Ordinance.
- We are grateful that the Department of Environmental Health for their hard work in this important area.
- We look forward to implementation of these regulations.

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

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing of which all interested persons will be heard, will be held before the Board of Supervisors of Riverside County, California, on the 1st Floor Board Chambers, County Administrative Center, 4080 Lemon Street, Riverside, on Tuesday, June 28, 2011 at 9:30 a.m. to consider adoption of the following ordinance:

SUMMARY OF PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 907 AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE REGULATING BODY ART FACILITIES, PERMA- NENT COSMETICS AND BODY PIERCING FACILITIES

This summary is presented pursuant to California Government Code Section 25124(b); a certified copy of the full text of Ordinance No. 907 may be examined at the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside located at 4080 Lemon Street, 1st Floor, Riverside, California.

Ordinance No. 907 establishes minimum standards that apply to body art facilities, including temporary facilities, and practitioners of body art to help protect both the practitioner and the client from transmission of infectious diseases. Body art includes body piercing, branding, permanent cosmetics, and tattooing. The ordinance requires owners, operators, and practitioners to follow safe and healthy practices, including the use of sterilized equipment and the maintenance of a sterile work environment.

The major components of Ordinance No. 907 do the following:

Requires all owners and operators of body art facilities to obtain a permit through the Riverside County Department of Environmental Health (the "Department"), create a Department approved exposure control plan to manage and minimize exposure to blood-borne pathogens, allow inspections of the facility by Department representatives, require practitioner employees to attend a Department approved bloodborne pathogens exposure control training, and comply with requirements pertaining to the physical facility itself, equipment sterilization, and autoclave requirements (if an autoclave is used).

Requires all practitioners of body art to register with the Department, practice only in permitted body art facilities, and attend bloodborne pathogens exposure control training.

Sets forth the associated fees for permits, inspections, and practitioner registrations. It also contains the penalties for violations of the ordinance requirements, which include criminal infractions, misdemeanors, monetary administrative penalties, injunctive relief, abatement, and other civil remedies.

Provides for notice and due process related to the denial, suspension, or revocation of body art facility permits or practitioner registrations issued by the Department.

Prohibits registered sex offenders (as defined under California Penal Code Section 290) from owning or operating a body art facility or practicing body art as a registered practitioner. It also prohibits body art facilities from being located within 2500 feet of a school, park, or other location where minors congregate.

Any person affected by the above matter(s) may submit written comments to the Clerk of the Board before the hearing or may appear and be heard in support or opposition to the project at the time of the hearing. If you challenge the above item(s) in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence, to the Board of Supervisors at, or prior to, the public hearing.

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
