SUBJECT: Acceptance of Corrections Standards Authority (CSA) funding for the Evidence

Based Practices Project.

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

1) Authorize the Chief Probation Officer to accept the grant award of \$58,143, awarded by the Corrections Standards Authority on September 14, 2011 for implementation and expansion of Evidence- Based Practices within Juvenile Probation Services.

2) Approve and direct the Auditor-Controller to make the budget adjustment as outlined in

the attached Schedule A for FY 2011/12.

BACKGROUND: On June 28, 2011, the Board of Supervisors approved Resolution No. 2011-192 authorizing submission of Riverside County Probation Department's proposal to participate in the Corrections Standards Authority's Evidence-Based Practices Project. On September 14, 2011 the Probation Department received an award letter for a grant award of \$58,143 for the grant period of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2013 (please refer to Attachment 1).

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The required 10% cash-match funds will be funded through the Riverside County Probation Department, a required match of \$5,814. The Probation Department intends to use this funding for implementation of several components of evidence-based practices for juveniles. Motivational Interviewing training for staff assigned to juvenile services, training for staff in a "Train the Trainer" course for evidence-based juvenile programming and purchase of the "Forward Thinking Interactive Journaling System" for juvenile offenders.

Motivational Interviewing is an evidence-based, client-centered, directive method for enhancing intrinsic motivation by using techniques such as open ended questions, and allowing clients to play an intricate role in the development of his/her caseplan. In training staff using this approach, the Probation Department intends to implement Motivational Interviewing in juvenile probation services.

The Probation Department has implemented "Courage to Change," an evidence-based, cognitive approach for treating adult offenders. This outcome-oriented supervision model incorporates research-to-results for addressing the needs of participants working to successfully reintegrate into their communities. Through the use of a cognitive-behavioral interactive journaling system and interaction with their resource team, participants address their individual problem areas. The Probation Department intends to implement a similar program for juvenile offenders called "Forward Thinking." Through the "Train the Trainer" course, juvenile probation staff will be able to continue to train staff after grant funding has expired, maintaining program sustainability.

The current fiscal year budget adjustment for the Probation Department is outlined in the attached Schedule A.

The acceptance of this funding has been reviewed by the Auditor-Controller, and approved as to form by County Counsel.
