SUBJECT: Resolution 2011-14, Establishing the Appropriations Limit for the Regional Park & Open-Space District Fiscal Year 2011-12

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board approves and:

1. Adopts Resolution 2011-14, which establishes the Regional Park and Open-Space District's (District) Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Appropriations Limit; and
2. Instructs the Clerk of the Board to return one copy to the District.

BACKGROUND: On November 6, 1990, a majority of voters in Riverside County voted to form the District. In that same measure, pursuant to Article XIII B of the California Constitution, the District's appropriations limit was set at \$25,000,000. Section 7910 of the Government Code requires that each year the governing body of each local jurisdiction adopt a resolution to establish its appropriations limit. The appropriations limit for FY 2011-2012 is set at \$78,421,110, as calculated by District staff (Attachment A). Documentation used in the determination of the appropriations limit was made available to the public fifteen days prior to subject resolution being adopted.

**RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL PARK
AND OPEN-SPACE DISTRICT ESTABLISHING THE APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR FISCAL
YEAR 2011-2012 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF DIVISION 9 OF TITLE 1 OF
THE CALIFORNIA GOVERNMENT CODE.**

**WHEREAS, Article XIII B of the Constitution of the State of California as proposed by
the Initiative Measure approved by statewide election on November 6, 1979, amended in June
1990 by statewide election (Proposition 111), provides that the total annual appropriations
subject to limitations of each local government shall not exceed the appropriations limit of
such entity for the prior year adjusted for changes in the cost of living and population except
as otherwise specifically provided for in said Article; and**

**WHEREAS, the State Legislature added Division 9 (commencing with Section 7900) to
Title 1 of the Government Code of the State of California to implement Article XIII B of the
Constitution; and**

**WHEREAS, Section 7910 of the Government Code provides that each year the
governing body of each local jurisdiction shall, by resolution, establish its appropriations
limit for the following fiscal year pursuant to Article XIII B at a regularly scheduled meeting or
a noticed special meeting and that fifteen days prior to such meeting, documentation used in
the determination of the appropriations limit shall be available to the public; and**

**WHEREAS Proposition 111 as approved by the voters of the State of California,
requires a recorded vote of the Board of Directors regarding which of the annual adjustment
factors have been selected each year; and**

**WHEREAS, Section 7902(b) of the Government Code sets forth the method for
determining the appropriations limit for each local jurisdiction for the 2011-2012 fiscal year;

13 accordance with Section 7902(b) of the California Government Code is
14 \$78,421,110.
