On motion of Supervisor Buster, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, December 13, 2011, is adjourned in memory of Rosanna Scott, a 78-year-old resident of Riverside and former two-term Riverside Councilwoman and civic activist who will always be remembered for her "quick-wit, artistic nature, and ability to find beauty anywhere, especially in Riverside."

Born in the Los Angeles area and earning bachelor's degrees from UCLA in art and political science, Rosanna moved to Riverside with her husband Bill and their children in the early 1960's and fell in love with the city. In 1971, she became the third woman elected to hold the Ward 4 City Council seat, making significant changes in the "attitude of council members" and their "willingness to be open and work with the public." She was also the first woman to serve as president of the Southern California Association of Governments and later worked for Riverside County Supervisor Melba Dunlap as an administrative assistant until they both retired in 1995. As a powerful force in the community who believed in "improving the quality of life and the environment," Rosanna was instrumental in creating the Citrus State Historic Park, establishing a domestic violence center for women and children, and pushing for the passage of Proposition R, a growth control measure approved in 1979, which preserved agriculture by requiring larger lots.

Rosanna was a devoted wife, mother, and grandmother whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed.
