After the war, he returned to Riverside and worked in the insurance business prior to changing careers and becoming a real estate broker. He opened his own firm, James W. Miller Real Estate Company on Magnolia Avenue, and was "proud" to be designated as a Certified Commercial Investment Manager by the National Association of Realtors.

Involved in a variety of business and community organizations, Jim was past President of the Exchange Club, a member of the Kiwanis Club, former Director of the YMCA, and Riverside Airport Commissioner. He also volunteered with Young Life working with third grade students at Longfellow Elementary School where he helped stage an annual Shakespeare Play.
