BACKGROUND: On September 13, 2011 (3.78), the Board of Supervisors approved the 2011/2012 Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) Award and Resolution No. 2011-179. The grant provides support for program related operations undertaken by the Coachella Valley Violent Gang Task Force (CVVGTF). The CVVGTF elects a city represented on the Task Force to act as "host city" for tracking and reporting purposes as well as handling the joint revenue and expenses. The aforementioned Form 11 authorized the Sheriff or designee to sign an agreement with the City of Indio for their portion of the grant, as they were the host city at the time.

In December 2011, the City of Indio notified Riverside County Sheriffs Department that the City of La Quinta will take over the role of the host city effective immediately and process expenditures on behalf of the Gang Task Force for services and supplies. As a result of this action, the Department has drafted an operational agreement for the grant project with La Quinta, which has been approved as to form by County Counsel. With the Board's approval, the Sheriff or designee will sign the agreement.

As shown in the funding table below, the host city was allocated \$14,023; the unspent balance of \$8,755 will be made available to the City of La Quinta for reimbursement of expenditures on behalf of the CVVGTF for services and supplies.
