BACKGROUND:

Government Code, Section 7074(a), which governs state enterprise zones, allows each jurisdiction to expand its geographic boundaries within the Enterprise Zone up to a maximum of 15% of the original zone boundary.

Several businesses adjacent to or near the existing enterprize zone's boundary have asked to be added to the Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone's boundry.

The boundary expansion is a combined total of 336.69 acres, which represents 1.79% of the total expansion allowed. The expanded acreage consists of commercial, industrial and residential areas in the unincorporated communities of Bermuda Dunes, Thermal and Mecca. The expansion will provide state tax credits and incentives to business and provides opportunities for job creation.

The cities' respective representatives of the Executive Committee for the Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone (the City of Indio and the City of Coachella) approved the County of Riverside's request to expand its boundaries and to move forward with the process.

County Counsel has reviewed the Resolution and approved it as to form. EDA staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution No.2012-023 approving the boundary expansion of the Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone within the County of Riverside and authorize the submittal of an boundary expansion application to the State of California, Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD).

The Board's action allows the application to be submitted to HCD to consider the proposed expansion which is subject to State approval. The expansion will not create additional costs and will have no impact upon the County's General Fund.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012-023 BOUNDARY EXPANSION OF THE COACHELLA VALLEY ENTERPRISE ZONE WITHIN THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE

WHEREAS, effective November 11, 2006, the City of Coachella, City of Indio and the County of Riverside, as Joint Power Authority, received official re-designation of the Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD); and,

WHEREAS, State Government Code, Section 7074(a) allows a jurisdiction to expand its geographic boundaries by 15% of the original zone's boundary; and

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside desires to expand its boundaries of their portion of the Enterprise Zone by a combined total of 336.69 acres which represents 1.79% of the 15% allowance, and

WHEREAS, The County desires to expand acreage within its unincorporated communities of Bermuda Dunes as described in Exhibit "A" and Thermal and Mecca as described in Exhibit "B", both attached hereto and incorporated herein, and

WHEREAS, the Joint Powers Agreement, Article VII (7.1) requires a unanimous vote by all three Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone's Executive Committee Members for any proposed expansion of the Enterprise Zone boundaries within the three jurisdictions, and

WHEREAS, by vote of their respective representatives of the Executive Committee for the Coachella Valley Enterprise Zone, the City of Indio, the City of Coachella and the County of Riverside, approved the County of Riverside's request to expand its boundaries and supports the submittal of the expansion application to HCD, and

WHEREAS, as required in Section 7074(b) of the State Government Code, the governing body of each jurisdiction must approve the expansion by ordinance or resolution; and

WHEREAS, both the City of Coachella and the City of Indio have approved by resolution the County of Riverside's request to expand its boundary, and

WHEREAS, the expanded acreage consists of commercial, industrial and residential areas which enhances opportunities for job creation and improve the quality of life of its residents, and

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WHEREAS, the proposed boundary expansion is subject to State approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, FOUND, DETERMINED, AND ORDERED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside in regular session assembled on March 13, 2012, as follows:

- That the expansion of requested areas shown in Exhibit "A" and Exhibit "B" hereto and incorporated herein indicates that the expanded areas are located within the jurisdiction of the County of Riverside, and
- 2. That the Board of Supervisors approve the boundary expansion, and
- 3. Authorize the submittal of an application to the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development to expand the boundary within the County of Riverside.


