Richard M. Milanovich grew up in Section 14 in Palm Springs, California, then a run-down area of high poverty and poor living conditions. He was the son of a Serbian steelworker, and his mother, LaVerne Saubel, served on the all-female tribal council that went to Washington, D.C. to make nondiscriminatory land lease reform.

A graduate of Palm Springs High School, Richard M. Milanovich served in the U.S. Army and was stationed in Munich, Germany, during the Cold War. He earned a degree from the University of Redlands and married Melissa in 1977.

He joined the Agua Caliente Tribal Council in 1978 and became chairman in 1984. He went to work with Cathedral City, Rancho Mirage and Riverside County on mutual land-use agreements that would be models for tribes throughout the country. He understood business and led the tribe, for 28 years as chairman, to a new level of prosperity through the purchase of the Spa Hotel in 1992, its transformation into the Spa Resort Casino and the establishment of the Agua Caliente Casino and hotel in Rancho Mirage.

Richard M. Milanovich is survived by his wife, Melissa, and six children: Scott, Reid, Trista, Sean, Travis and Tammy.

Richard M. Milanovich was a kind, humble, good-natured and bighearted leader who will be remembered for his lifetime of service to his tribe and to the betterment of the entire community. He will be dearly missed.

On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Buster, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, March 13, 2012, be adjourned in memory of Idriss "René" Salah, an 86 year-old resident of Thousand Palms who was a "living example of good-heartedness and reliability." He will always be remembered as a "man of great personal generosity and commitment who asked very little for himself and gave service whenever he was needed."

Born on September 23, 1925, near the ancient city of Baalbek, Lebanon, René joined the French marines in 1943, where he became a parachutist, executing approximately 400 parachute jumps in training and in battle. He fought with the Free French in World War II, first being assigned duty in Africa, then in Madagascar, Vietnam, and Algeria. He won the Croix de Guerre for bravery in action, and France's highest military honor, the Medaille Militaire, along with many other medals for his contributions in the field.

After the military, René had a career in banking at the Credit Lyonnais, then moved on to become the director of a forestry company in Gabon with 200 African workers under his orders. He was honored by the president of Gabon with the African Ordre National de Merit for having organized a rescue party to save the president's son whose plane went down in the jungles near Libreville. He also brought electricity to the jungle villages and organized the construction of schools and medical clinics and served as a judge when he visited the tribal encampments inside the forest.

When he settled in America, René became a dual French-American citizen and was proud of both his adopted countries. In 1996, he became president and treasurer of the French Club of the Desert and was hired by Guardsmark as a security officer for the Riverside County Courthouse in Indio where he worked full-time until his death. As an American citizen, he valued the open-minded melting pot of cultures here where he could work and be shown respect by the deputies, judges, and other co-workers for the man he had become.

A devoted husband to his wife Patricia of 25 years, his memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. René will be deeply missed.

"Chuck" Gunnoe, an 83-year-old prominent resident and longest-practicing physician in Corona for 56 years who "knew his patients from inside out" and will always be remembered as "a country doctor."

Born in Chicago, on September 25, 1928, Chuck's "boyhood ambition" was to become a doctor. After serving in the U.S. Air Force, he attended Indiana University and graduated with honors. As the first recipient of the Indiana State Medical Association Scholarship, he graduated with a medical degree from Indiana University and was chief resident physician before settling in Corona.

In 1956, Chuck completed his residency at the old Riverside General Hospital and took over the practice of Dr. John Pritchard. Envisioning growth and the need for additional medical services in his new city, he purchased 12 acres on Magnolia Avenue as the site of a second hospital in Corona. Eight years later, he and his partners began building Circle City Hospital which was sold to a public corporation in 1969 and consolidated in 1995 with Corona Community Hospital to form Corona Regional Medical Center.

Dr. Gunnoe's commitment to the community went beyond serving patients, as he was founder of the local Jaycees, president of the Corona Chamber of Commerce in 1962, it's Citizen of the Year in 1996, and owner of Deerfield Station, the city's first gourmet restaurant. Before retiring in March 2010, Dr. Gunnoe saw over 200,000 patients and continued to see some patients at his ranch in South Corona.

Chuck was a loving husband to his wife Becky of 35 years, and a devoted father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and friend. He also enjoyed playing golf, tennis, and bowling and liked to "get dirty working on their ranch equipment." His memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be deeply missed.
