On motion of Supervisor Benoit, seconded by Supervisor Tavaglione, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, April 10, 2012, is adjourned in memory of Floyd Atkin Marlow, a 63-year-old resident from Blythe and former Riverside County Deputy Sheriff who after a courageous battle with heart disease, succumbed to the disease on March 28, 2012. His death comes as a great loss to his family, friends, and an entire community.

Born the third of four children on August 24, 1948, in Palo Verde Hospital, Blythe, to David and Ella Louise Marlowe, Floyd started working on the family farm at a very young age. After graduating from Palo Verde High School in 1966, he attended college at Cal Poly Pomona, and went on to work with the Employment Development Department as a supervisor. In August 1973, he began his career with the Riverside County Sheriff's Department as a patrol officer and later became a detective and worked in narcotics. Ending his career as a homicide investigator with the rank of sergeant, Frank medically retired in 1990.

After retirement, he enjoyed helping individuals as a private investigator and paralegal, in addition to assisting the department with solving many crimes. In 2000, Floyd "officially" joined the "Sizzler Team" at his family's Sizzler in Blythe, where he loved visiting with guests and could always be recognized by his "Cowboy hat."

Although he was never in the military, Floyd was a patriotic man who showed his support by developing the "Run for the Wall" in Blythe, which honors all American soldiers on an annual motorcycle trip to the Veteran Memorial Wall in Washington D.C., and in 2000, he was recognized as an "Honorary Army Recruiter." He was also recognized by Master Antique Adams of Antique's School of Shotokan Karate in 2006 for his ongoing support and was honored as "Director of the Year" by Blythe Chamber of Commerce in 2007.

Floyd was a loving family man and friend whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed.
