Spradlin, a 103-year-old prominent resident of Homeland whose "long, wonderful life leaves her family and friends with a legacy of great stories, laughs, and beautiful memories."

Born one of 12 children to Rufus and Margaret Aker, on February 28, 1909 in Tecumseh, Oklahoma, Ellen moved to California in 1938, where she and her husband, Fred E. Spradlin, settled in Homeland to raise their six children. An instrumental force in the community, she established the post office in Homeland in 1949, after petitioning Congress, and retired after 26 years of service as their only Postmaster.

A passionate woman who enjoyed crocheting, sewing, quilting, cooking, fishing, camping, Nascar, and quality time with her loved ones, Ellen was a loyal wife to her husband Fred of 57 years who preceded her in death and a devoted mother, grandmother, great-grandmother, great-great-grandmother, aunt, and friend. Her memory and generous spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed.
