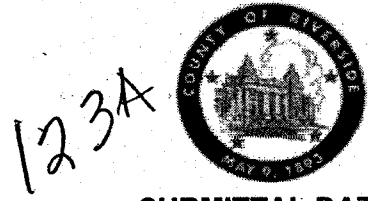

BACKGROUND:

On October 26, 2011, DPSS submitted an application for Homeless Assistance funds to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). On December 20, 2011, HUD announced the approval of twenty-four (24) renewal grants for Riverside County's homeless projects.

In accordance with Board Resolution No. 2010-045, approved by the Board on May 25, 2010 (Item 3.38), the authority to accept McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act funding was delegated to the Director of DPSS. With the full execution of the attached Grant Agreements by HUD, the Grant Agreements are being submitted to the Board to receive and file as the official copies of record.

Following is a brief description of each program:

Operation SafeHouse, a non-profit organization, provides transitional housing to twenty (20) Riverside County youths (ages 18-21). The facility is located in the city of Riverside and is known as Main Street Transitional Housing. Services offered include case management, life skills, employment, transportation, education and health care assistance. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

Jewish Family Service of San Diego is a non-profit organization located in the Coachella Valley that operates Desert Vista Permanent Supportive Housing program. Desert Vista serves forty (40) homeless individuals living with chronic substance abuse, severe mental illness, veterans, and/or HIV/AIDS with Permanent Supportive Housing. Services offered include housing, case management, life skills, and education and transportation assistance. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

Path of Life Ministries (POLM), a non-profit organization, provides transitional housing for forty-six (46) families with children and four (4) individuals. The facility is located on the March Air Reserve Base and is known as King Hall Transitional Housing. Services offered include housing, case management, life skills, transportation, child care and employment assistance. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The United States Veterans Initiative is a non-profit organization located at March Air Reserve Base in Moreno Valley. The Veterans In Progress program offers forty (40) beds of Transitional Housing including Supportive Services to homeless Veterans. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

Lutheran Social Services, a non-profit organization located in Riverside, operates Amelia's Light Transitional Living Program. Amelia's Light provides twenty-two (22) units of Transitional Housing to homeless women with children while they participate in a comprehensive case managed program that transitions them to self-sufficiency. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

Jewish Family Service of San Diego operates the Desert Horizon SOS Transitional Living Program in the Coachella Valley. The program offers thirty-two (32) beds of Transitional Housing and intensive case management to homeless individuals. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

Shelter from the Storm operates the Florence Rigdon House transitional housing project, an eighteen (18) unit, thirty-six (36) bedroom program located in the desert area. Participants and their children may stay up to twenty-four (24) months. One hundred percent (100%) of residents in this program are homeless and victims of domestic violence. It is anticipated that all eligible clients will come from emergency shelters. This Agreement provides funding for supportive services, operations, and administrative costs. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

BACKGROUND, cont.:

Family Services Association, a non-profit organization, operates the Permanent Housing Program for Disabled Women with Children. The program provides twelve (12) scattered site apartments and supportive services for women disabled due to physical/mental impairments and their children up to age 18. The program will enable disabled women with children to live as independently as possible in a permanent setting that supports their special needs and those of their children. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

ABC Recovery Center, a non-profit organization, operates the Transitional Living Village located in Indio. The Village is a forty (40) bed project which provides Transitional Housing to individuals recovering from substance abuse. Residents are offered aftercare services as well as life skills training. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

SVDP Management Inc., a non-profit agency, operates Martha's Village & Kitchen. The program located in the Coachella Valley is a comprehensive Supportive Housing Program consisting of one hundred and twenty (120) Transitional Housing beds for single adults and families with on-site supportive services. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

MFI Recovery, Inc., a non-profit organization located in Riverside, operates A Woman's Place Transitional Living Program. The program utilizes a fifteen (15) unit apartment complex that provides Transitional Housing and Supportive Services for homeless women and their children after completion of a substance abuse program. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

City of Riverside Homeless Street Outreach Program conducts daily mobile outreach and client services focused on the "hardest-to-reach" and "service-resistant" populations on the streets, in service venues and other locations with the goal of getting them connected with the services they need that leads to stable housing. Available services include outreach, case management, life skills, alcohol and/or drug abuse services, mental health, education, housing placement, employment assistance, and transportation. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

City of Riverside Permanent Supportive Housing for Disabled provides up to eight (8) disabled homeless persons with housing and supportive services such as health and mental health care, substance abuse services, benefits and/or employment assistance and basic life skills through on site and off site case management coordination. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

City of Riverside Supportive Housing for Chronically Homeless provides up to eight (8) chronically homeless persons with a permanent supportive housing environment designed to address their multiple needs, such as health care, mental illness, substance abuse, benefits and/or employment assistance and basic life skills, through on site and off site case management coordination. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The Riverside County Department of Mental Health's Riverside Permanent Housing (also known as *The Place*) is a twenty-five (25) unit permanent supportive housing program with a 24-hour drop in center, serving the most-visible and hardest-to-reach homeless persons with severe mental illness, who have been unable or unwilling to participate in supportive services. Intensive case management, life skills training and mental health treatment is available to all residents. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

BACKGROUND, cont.:

The Riverside County Department of Mental Health's Outreach Desert Expansion grant funds service providers in the Desert/Mid-county region to do outreach to a minimum of 400 individuals each grant year. Each individual contacted through the outreach program is offered an initial assessment as well as referrals and linkage to various community services. Individuals who agree to further engagement may receive a more in-depth assessment, linkage to mental health providers and emergency housing. The outreach teams partner with the community shelters and agencies to facilitate referrals and linkage as well as outreach to their clients. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The Riverside County Department of Mental Health's Coachella Valley Permanent Housing (formerly known as Desert SafeHaven) is a twenty-five (25) unit permanent supportive housing program with a 24-hour drop-in center, serving the most-visible and hardest-to-reach homeless persons with severe mental illness, who have been unable or unwilling to participate in supportive services. Intensive case management, life skills training and mental health treatment is available to all residents. Due to HUD changes, the program is now designated as a Permanent Housing Program, yet will retain the SafeHaven model of low demand services within a permanent housing framework. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The Riverside County Department of Mental Health's Men's Permanent Housing Program utilizes eleven (11) scattered site permanent housing units to serve eleven (11) participants and provide them with access to various supportive services to facilitate achievement of the individual participants' goal to become self-sufficient and maintain stable permanent housing for more than six (6) months. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The Riverside County Department of Mental Health's Women's Permanent Housing Program utilizes seven (7) scattered, permanent housing units to serve seven (7) female participants with mental illness and provide them with access to various supportive services to facilitate achievement of the individual participant's goal to become self-sufficient. Along with permanent housing, ongoing case management and mental health services are provided. One hundred percent (100%) of homeless persons served under this Grant are expected to come from the street or other locations not meant for human habitation, or emergency shelters. There is no change to the population served, service site or mode of service delivery.

The Housing Authority of the County of Riverside's Shelter Plus Care All County #1 is a 32 unit project to provide tenant based rental assistance for homeless mentally ill individuals. Participants receive tenant based rental assistance in mainstream housing of their choosing and comprehensive mental health services through the County's Department of Mental Health. There was an increase in units from twenty-eight (28) to thirty-two (32).

The Housing Authority of the County of Riverside's Shelter Plus Care (S+C) consolidated All County program provides permanent supportive housing to homeless persons and families with severe disabilities. The program targets individuals who are living on the streets and suffer from severe mental health illness. Participants receive tenant based rental assistance in mainstream housing of their choosing and comprehensive mental health services through the County's Department of Mental Health. There were no reductions in the number of persons to be served, or changes in the services to be provided. Under the consolidated grant, the Housing Authority of the County of Riverside will provide at least forty-one (41) units of tenant-based rental assistance to persons throughout the county. Services provided include case management, life skills, mental health and transportation.

BACKGROUND, cont.:

The Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) is web-based software required by HUD that allows the County to more effectively assess homeless needs, allocate resources, and coordinate services through its enhanced tracking and reporting capabilities. HMIS implementation presents the Riverside County Continuum of Care (CoC) with an opportunity to re-examine how homeless services are provided in the community, and to make informed decisions, and develop appropriate action steps. The implementation of the County's HMIS allows community stakeholders to build new alliances, to strengthen services, meet consumer needs in a more streamlined manner, and obtain information to guide future planning.

HMIS 2010 Expansion Project provides for continued expansion and training for providers using the required HMIS web-based software.

FINANCIAL DATA: No County General Funds are required. Funding is 100% Federal.

2011 SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM RENEWAL GRANT AGREEMENT

This Grant Agreement is made by and between the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and the Recipient, which is described in section 1 of Attachment A, attached hereto and made a part hereof.

The assistance which is the subject of this Grant Agreement is authorized by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act 42 U.S.C. 11381 (hereafter "the Act"). The term "grant" or "grant funds" means the assistance provided under this Agreement. This grant agreement will be governed by the Act; the Supportive Housing rule codified at 24 CFR 583, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof as Attachment B, and the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA), that was published in two parts. The first part was the Policy Requirements and General Section of the NOFA, and the second part was the Continuum of Care Assistance Programs section of the NOFA, which are located at <http://archives.12011/fundsavail.cfm>. The term "Application" means the original and renewal of submissions, including the certifications and assurances, the Technical Submissions information or documentation required to meet any grant award conditions, on which HUD approved a grant. The Application is incorporated herein as part of this Agreement, however, in the event of a conflict between any part of the Application and any Agreement, the latter shall control. The Secretary agrees, subject to the terms of the Agreement, to provide the grant funds in the amount specified at section 2 of Attachment A approved project described in the application. The Recipient agrees, subject to the terms of the Grant Agreement, to use the grant funds for eligible activities during the term specified at section 3 of Attachment A.

The Recipient must provide a 25 percent cash match for supportive services.

The Recipient agrees to comply with all requirements of this Grant Agreement and to accept responsibility for such compliance by any entities to which it makes grant funds available.

The Recipient agrees to participate in a local Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) when implemented.

The Recipient and project sponsor, if any, will not knowingly allow illegal activities in any unit assisted with grant funds.

The Recipient agrees to draw grant funds at least quarterly.

For any project funded by this grant, which is also financed through the use of the Low Income Housing Tax Credit, the following applies:

HUD recognizes that the Recipient or the project sponsor will or has financed this project through the use of the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit. The Recipient or project sponsor shall be the general partner of a limited partnership formed for that purpose. If grant funds were used for acquisition, rehabilitation or construction, then, throughout a period of twenty years from the date of initial occupancy or the initial service provision, the Recipient or project sponsor shall continue as general partner and shall ensure that the project is operated in accordance with the requirements of this Grant Agreement, the applicable regulations and statutes. Further, the said limited partnership shall own the project site throughout that twenty-year period. If grant funds were not used for acquisition, rehabilitation or new construction, then the period shall not be twenty years, but shall be for the term of the grant agreement and any renewal thereof. Failure to comply with the terms of this paragraph shall constitute a default under the Grant Agreement.

A default shall consist of any use of grant funds for a purpose other than as authorized by this Grant Agreement, failure in the Recipient's duty to provide the supportive housing for the minimum term in accordance with the requirements of the Attachment A provisions, noncompliance with the Act or Attachment B provisions, any other material breach of the Grant Agreement, or misrepresentations in the application submissions which, if known by HUD, would have resulted in this grant not being provided. Upon due notice to the Recipient of the occurrence of any such default and the provision of a reasonable opportunity to respond, HUD may take one or more of the following actions:

- (a) direct the Recipient to submit progress schedules for completing approved activities; or
- (b) issue a letter of warning advising the Recipient of the default, establishing a date by which corrective actions must be completed and putting the Recipient on notice that more serious actions will be taken if the default is not corrected or is repeated; or
- (c) direct the Recipient to establish and maintain a management plan that assigns responsibilities for carrying out remedial actions; or
- (d) direct the Recipient to suspend, discontinue or not incur costs for the affected activity; or

- (e) reduce or recapture the grant; or
- (f) direct the Recipient to reimburse the program accounts for costs inappropriately charged to the program; or
- (g) continue the grant with a substitute Recipient of HUD's choosing; or
- (h) other appropriate action including, but not limited to, any remedial action legally available, such as affirmative litigation seeking declaratory judgment, specific performance, damages, temporary or permanent injunctions and any other available remedies.

No delay or omission by HUD in exercising any right or remedy available to it under this Grant Agreement shall impair any such right or remedy or constitute a waiver or acquiescence in any Recipient default.

The Grantee shall comply with requirements established by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) concerning the Dun and Bradstreet Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS), the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) database, and the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act, including Appendix A to Part 25 of the *Financial Assistance Use of Universal Identifier and Central Contractor Registration*, 75 Fed. Reg. 55671 (Sept. 14, 2010) (to be codified at 2 CFR part 25) and Appendix A to Part 170 of the *Requirements for Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act Implementation*, 75 Fed. Reg. 55663 (Sept. 14, 2010) (to be codified at 2 CFR part 170).

This Grant Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and may be amended only in writing executed by HUD and the Recipient. More specifically, the Recipient shall not change recipients, location, services, or population to be served nor shift more than 10 percent of funds from one approved type of eligible activity to another without the prior written approval of HUD. The effective date of this Grant Agreement shall be the date of execution by HUD, except with prior written approval by HUD.

The term "Application" means the original and renewal application submissions, including the certifications and assurances, the Technical Submission, and any information or documentation required to meet any grant award conditions, on the basis of which HUD approved a grant. The Application is incorporated herein as part of this Agreement, however, in the event of a conflict between any part of the Application and any part of the Grant Agreement, the latter shall control. The Secretary agrees, subject to the terms of the Grant Agreement, to provide the grant funds in the amount specified at section 2 of Attachment A for the approved project described in the application. The Recipient agrees, subject to the terms of the Grant Agreement, to use the grant funds for eligible activities during the term specified at section 3 of Attachment A.

The Recipient must provide a 25 percent cash match for supportive services.

The Recipient agrees to comply with all requirements of this Grant Agreement and to accept responsibility for such compliance by any entities to which it makes grant funds available.

The Recipient agrees to participate in a local Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) when implemented.

The Recipient and project sponsor, if any, will not knowingly allow illegal activities in any unit assisted with grant funds.

The Recipient agrees to draw grant funds at least quarterly.

For any project funded by this grant, which is also financed through the use of the Low Income Housing Tax Credit, the following applies:

HUD recognizes that the Recipient or the project sponsor will or has financed this project through the use of the Low-Income Housing Tax Credit. The Recipient or project sponsor shall be the general partner of a limited partnership formed for that purpose. If grant funds were used for acquisition, rehabilitation or construction, then, throughout a period of twenty years from the date of initial occupancy or the initial service provision, the Recipient or project sponsor shall continue as general partner and shall ensure that the project is operated in accordance with the requirements of this Grant Agreement, the applicable regulations and statutes. Further, the said limited partnership shall own the project site throughout that twenty-year period. If grant funds were not used for acquisition, rehabilitation or new construction, then the period shall not be twenty years, but shall be for the term of the grant agreement and any renewal thereof. Failure to comply with the terms of this paragraph shall constitute a default under the Grant Agreement.

A default shall consist of any use of grant funds for a purpose other than as authorized by this Grant Agreement, failure in the Recipient's duty to provide the supportive housing for the minimum term in accordance with the requirements of the Attachment A provisions, noncompliance with the Act or Attachment B provisions, any other material breach of the Grant Agreement, or misrepresentations in the application submissions which, if known by HUD, would have resulted in this grant not being provided. Upon due notice to the Recipient of the occurrence of any such default and the provision of a reasonable opportunity to respond, HUD may take one or more of the following actions:

- (a) direct the Recipient to submit progress schedules for completing approved activities; or
- (b) issue a letter of warning advising the Recipient of the default, establishing a date by which corrective actions must be completed and putting the Recipient on notice that more serious actions will be taken if the default is not corrected or is repeated; or
- (c) direct the Recipient to establish and maintain a management plan that assigns responsibilities for carrying out remedial actions; or
- (d) direct the Recipient to suspend, discontinue or not incur costs for the affected activity; or

- (e) reduce or recapture the grant; or
- (f) direct the Recipient to reimburse the program accounts for costs inappropriately charged to the program; or
- (g) continue the grant with a substitute Recipient of HUD's choosing; or
- (h) other appropriate action including, but not limited to, any remedial action legally available, such as affirmative litigation seeking declaratory judgment, specific performance, damages, temporary or permanent injunctions and any other available remedies.

No delay or omission by HUD in exercising any right or remedy available to it under this Grant Agreement shall impair any such right or remedy or constitute a waiver or acquiescence in any Recipient default.

The Grantee shall comply with requirements established by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) concerning the Dun and Bradstreet Data Universal Numbering System (DUNS), the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) database, and the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act, including Appendix A to Part 25 of the *Financial Assistance Use of Universal Identifier and Central Contractor Registration*, 75 Fed. Reg. 55671 (Sept. 14, 2010)(to be codified at 2 CFR part 25) and Appendix A to Part 170 of the *Requirements for Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act Implementation*, 75 Fed. Reg. 55663 (Sept. 14, 2010) (to be codified at 2 CFR part 170).

This Grant Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties hereto, and may be amended only in writing executed by HUD and the Recipient. More specifically, the Recipient shall not change recipients, location, services, or population to be served nor shift more than 10 percent of funds from one approved type of eligible activity to another without the prior written approval of HUD. The effective date of this Grant Agreement shall be the date of execution by HUD, except with prior written approval by HUD.
