Local governments impacted by tribal gaming made application, with tribal sponsorship, to the CBC.

BACKGROUND (Cont.):

In October 2011, AB1417 appropriated \$9.1 million in Special Distribution Funds statewide. These funds provide grants to local government agencies impacted by tribal gaming. Funding priorities include: law enforcement, fire/emergency medical services, environmental impacts, water supplies, waste disposal, behavioral health, planning/adjacent land uses, public health, roads, recreation/youth and child care programs.

On May 21, 2012, the CBC made recommendations to the state for mitigation grants in the amount of \$2.47 million (Riverside County's share); of this total amount received, the Sheriff's Department was awarded \$309,194. In addition, of the \$1,288,619 awarded in FY 11/12, a balance of approximately \$421,150 remains and will be expended in the first two quarters of FY 12/13.
