SUBJECT: Initiation of the Revision of the Body Art Ordinance 907

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1. Pursuant to Board Policy A67, adopt an order initiating the revision of Ordinance 907 of the County of Riverside Regulating Body Art Facilities, Permanent Cosmetics and Body Piercing Facilities; and
- 2. Direct County Counsel to prepare and process the revised ordinance.

BACKGROUND: In August of 2011, Ordinance 907 was passed by the Board of Supervisors to create a defined set of standards for health and safety at body art facilities within Riverside County due to the lack of state-wide regulations. On July 1, 2012, the State of California implemented the Safe Body Art Act, which provided standards for the regulation of the body art industry statewide.

BACKGROUND:

Considerable time and effort has been expended to determine if changes are necessary. Accordingly, Ordinance 907 needs to be revised to remove any sections that conflict with the Safe Body Art Act and to make reference to the Safe Body Art Act as the lead statute for body art regulation. The revised Ordinance 907 contains only those items that are particular to the County of Riverside and those areas that were not addressed in the Safe Body Art Act. Some sections of the Riverside County Ordinance may need to be removed due to the conflict.
