On motion of Supervisor Stone, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, May 8, 2012, is adjourned in memory of U.S. Marine Corps Master Sergeant Scott E. Pruitt, a 38-year-old resident of Murrieta who died with honor on April 28, 2012, while serving our Country in Helmand Province, Afghanistan.

After graduating from Pascagoula High School in 1992 in Gautier, Mississippi, Scott enlisted in the military in 1993 and was assigned to I Marine Expeditionary Force Headquarters Group at Camp Pendleton, California. A "true American hero and a great Mississippian," Scott was killed by an improvised explosive device two months after he had volunteered to return to combat "because he thought it was the right thing to do." He received a Purple Heart, was a three-time recipient of the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, and had numerous other military honors.

Scott was a loving family man who planned to marry the love of his life when he returned from Afghanistan and is the father of two beautiful children. His memory and selfless spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.

On motion of Supervisor Tavaglione, seconded by Supervisor Benoit, and duly carried by unanimous vote, IT WAS ORDERED that the meeting of Tuesday, May 8, 2012, be adjourned in memory of Maggie Mae, a 14-year-old "highly decorated" bloodhound and "star" of the Riverside County Sheriff's Department who will always be remembered as a "loyal and outstanding law enforcement professional within the K-9 service."

Soon after Deputy Coby Webb and Maggie Mae joined the Sheriff's Department as volunteers in 1999, Maggie was the first to find a lost hiker near the top of the tram on Mount San Jacinto. As the first bloodhound hired by the Riverside County Sheriff's Department, Maggie led the way in their fulltime Bloodhound unit, which recently received a Medal of Valor. Working on some of the most notable cases in Southern California, including the kidnappings of Samantha Runnion and Danielle Van Dam, Maggie's tracking abilities won her several awards such as Officer of the Year in Moreno Valley, the Distinguished Service Medal, the American Kennel Club's Top Tracking Police Dog Award two years in a row, and the Hero's Award. While travelling across the country with the National Police Bloodhound Association, she was instrumental in starting numerous law enforcement bloodhound programs and was honored by the California Police Officer's Association when she retired in 2010.

Maggie Mae was a "best friend and partner" to Deputy Coby Webb, an "unofficial nanny" to Coby's twins, and a devoted member of the Sheriff's Department who "never gave up on a track." Her memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved her. She will be dearly missed.
