BACKGROUND:

Effective February 1, 2012, all redevelopment agencies in the State of California were dissolved. Pursuant to the ABx1 26 (dissolution bill), on January 10, 2012, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 2012-034, accepting the designation as Successor Agency for the Redevelopment Agency for the County of Riverside pursuant to CA Health and Safety Code section 34171(j) and further delegating such actions and functions to be performed as Successor Agency to the Economic Development Agency.

Successor agencies are required to undertake the remainder of the actions required for the winding down of redevelopment activity, pursuant to the dissolution bill, including the submission of a Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) and a corresponding Administrative Budget for the Successor Agency for each six-month reporting period. On May 1, 2012, Agenda Item 4.2, the Board of Supervisors adopted, the ROPS for the period of July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. Subsequent to this action, the ROPS the Oversight Board to the Successor Agency adopted the ROPS on May 3, 2012. The total amount for the Administrative Budget for the Successor Agency was shown on the ROPS as \$1,064,485. This is the anticipated expense for the Successor Agency staff to conduct winding down activities for the former redevelopment agency for the period July-December 2012.

On June 6, 2012, the Auditor-Controller's Property Tax division calculated the June property tax allocation which required an adjustment of \$270,270. Based on our recommendation, this adjustment will result in a reduction of our administrative cost allowance from \$1,015,675 to \$745,405. As shown on Exhibit "A", the Administrative Budget for the Successor Agency for the period from July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012 is now projected to be \$794,215. Of this amount, \$745,405 would be funded from the Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF). This amount represents the three-percent (3%) administrative allowance of all RPTTF projections for the six-month period from July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012, as shown on the ROPS for \$1,015,675 but reduced by the adjustment of \$270,270. The remaining \$48,810 anticipated budget will be funded from available reserves. Exhibit "B" details cost categories associated with the projected Administrative Budget for July-December 2012. Costs are broken down between Successor Agency direct costs and indirect costs, for a total of \$794,215.

Staff recommends adoption of the Administrative Budget (Exhibits "A" and "B") of \$794,215 for the Successor Agency for the period of July 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012, and authorization for staff to submit this item to the Oversight Board.
