We appreciate you reading this letter and giving consideration to our concerns.

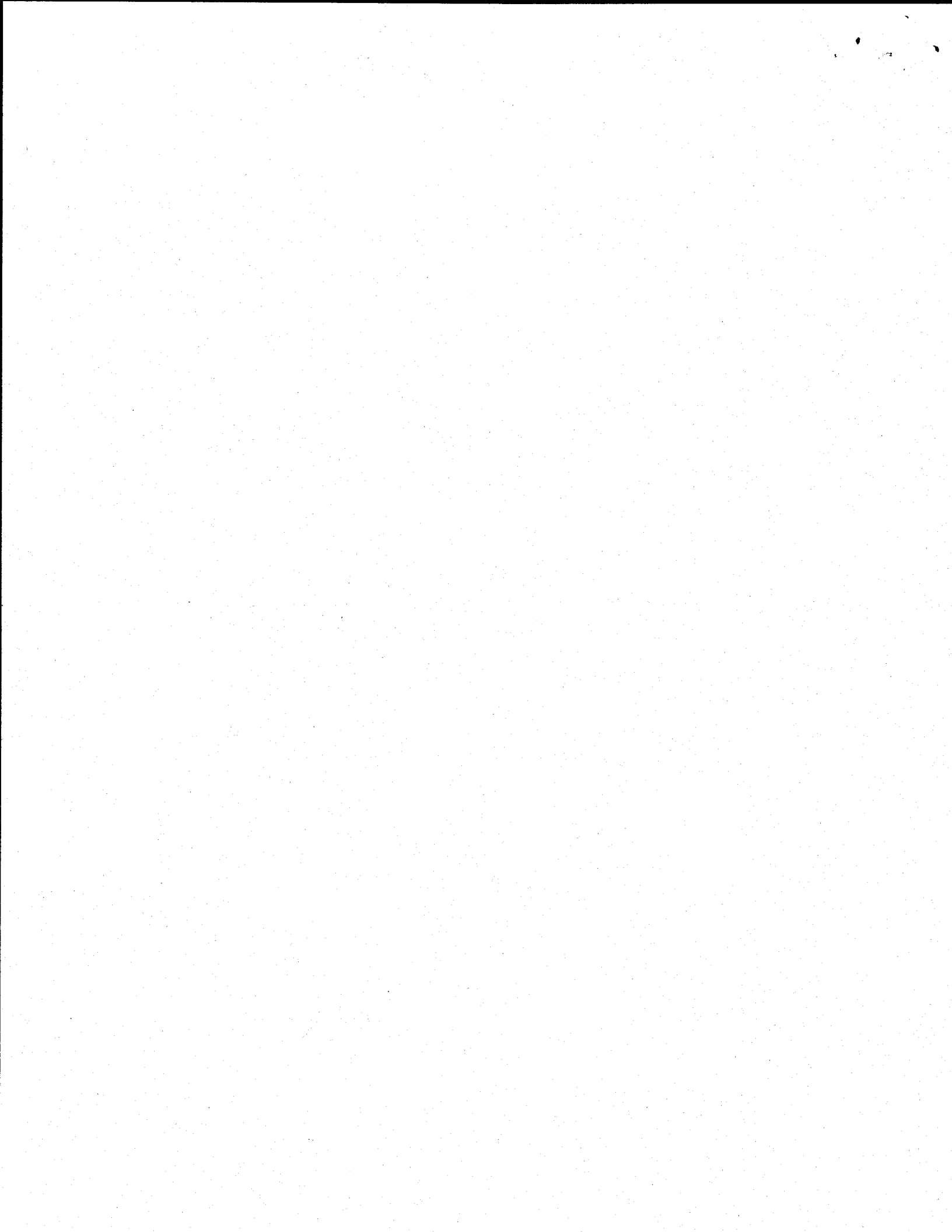

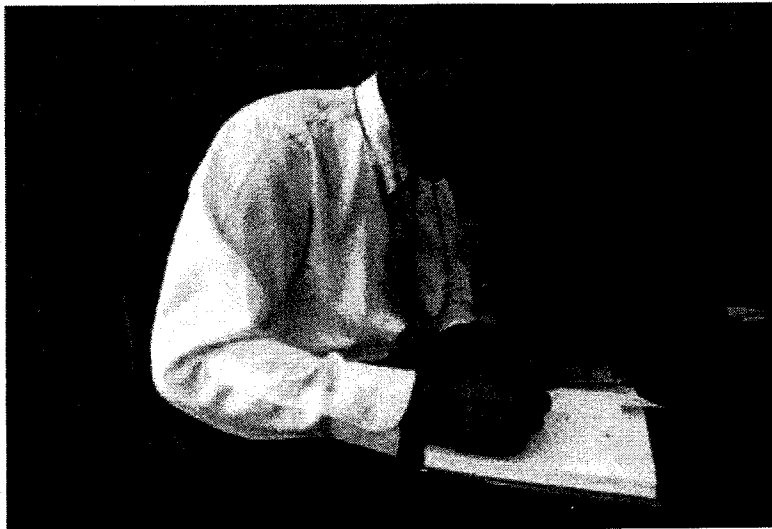

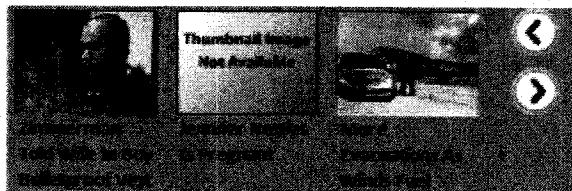
