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## **BACKGROUND**: (Continued)

The COUNTY Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) provides for improvements to the existing Union Pacific Railroad at grade crossing located on Clay Street, which is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City of Jurupa Valley.

The proposed project will grade separate Clay Street as an underpass (depressed roadway) under the proposed railroad bridge structure that will maintain the UPRR mainline track at the current grade. This grade separation project will improve vehicular traffic circulation and safety and will provide uninterrupted and efficient access for motorists, residents, businesses, pedestrians and emergency vehicles in the area. Additionally, the project will also enhance the operational characteristics (i.e. speed, efficiency, and reliability) of freight and passenger trains through Riverside County by eliminating conflicts between railroad operations and vehicular traffic.

Funding for the project is being provided from the Trade Corridor and Improvement Fund (TCIF), from the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAC) Improvement Program and from the Federal Highways Administration (FHWA) funding programs. TCIF funding requirements include a stipulation that a construction contract must be executed on or before December 31, 2013.

COUNTY is designated as the lead agency for these fund and has obtained environmental clearance, is substantially complete with the preparation of plans, specifications and estimates and has intiated acquisition of needed real property interests.

The project now lies within the jurisdiction of Jurupa Valley since it's incorporation. The City desires to have the County maintain responsibility for completing the project.

In order for the County to complete the right-of-way acquisition activities on behalf of the City, should condemnation become necessary, the City and the County must each pass a resolution to jointly exercise the powers of eminent domain.

The City of Jurupa Valley adopted a Resolution on February 7, 2013 authorizing the County to act as lead agency to exercise the powers of eminent domain for the Clay Street/Union Pacific Railroad Grade Separation Project.

In the event the County is unable to negotiate voluntary purchases of properties necessary for the Project, this resolution sets the Board of Supervisors as the hearing body for resolutions related to eminent domain.

This Form 11 has been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to legal form.

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### **RESOLUTION NO. 2013-051**

RESOLUTION AGREEING TO HEAR FUTURE RESOLUTIONS OF NECESSITY FOR THE CLAY STREET/UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD GRADE SEPARATION PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the County of Riverside ("County") is empowered to acquire property by eminent domain pursuant to Article 1, Section 19 of the California Constitution, and pursuant to various statutes including Sections 1230.010 et seg. of the California Code of Civil Procedure, and

WHEREAS, the County and the City of Jurupa Valley ("City") consider the Clay Street/Union Pacific Railroad Grade Separation Project (Project") to be a priority project, and

WHEREAS, the City has represented that it desires for the County to act as lead agency for purposes of providing land acquisition services and exercising eminent domain, if necessary, in relation to the Project, and

WHEREAS, California Government Code section 6502 provides that "[I]f authorized by their legislative or governing bodies, two or more public agencies by agreement may jointly exercise any power common to the contracting parties," and

WHEREAS, California Code of Civil Procedure section 1240.140(b) provides that "[t]wo or more public agencies may enter into an agreement for the joint exercise of their respective powers of eminent domain, whether or not possessed in common, for the acquisition of property as a single parcel," and

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2013 the City adopted Resolution No. 2013-03, a "Resolution of the City Council of the City of Jurupa Valley, California Agreeing to Jointly Exercise Powers of Eminent Domain, and Directing and Authorizing the County of Riverside, California to Act as Lead Agency and Condemn Certain Properties within the City of Jurupa Valley." Pursuant to Resolution No. 2013-03, the City expressly granted to the County the City's power of eminent domain to acquire necessary real property interests within the City in connection with the Project, and

WHEREAS, the County desires to acquire real property interests required for the Project and, if necessary, jointly exercise the County's power of eminent domain with the City to acquire such property interests.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Riverside, State of California, not less than four-fifths of all members concurring, in regular session assembled on February 26, 2013, that this Board hereby agrees as follows:

**SECTION 1.** 

Pursuant to Government Code section 6502 and Code of Civil Procedure section 1240.140, the County (i) accepts the City's grant of the power of eminent domain as set forth in City Resolution No. 2013-03, and (ii) agrees to act as lead agency with the City for the purposes of land acquisition and eminent domain, if necessary, in connection with the Project; and
