Born June 4, 1977, in San Bernardino, Jeremiah was raised in Lake Arrowhead and graduated from Rim of the World High School in 1995. Graduating from the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Academy on his 21st birthday, he worked as a Deputy Sheriff at the Central Detention Center, Twin Peaks, and Central Patrol stations. In 2006, he was promoted to Detective and assigned to the Sheriff's Training Center in addition to the Twin Peaks, Big Bear, and Yucaipa stations. He was also a "proud" member of the Sheriff's Honor Guard and the Emerald Society, playing bagpipes for many ceremonies. A "decorated veteran" of the Sheriff's Department, he was recognized five times by the California Highway Patrol and received several Commander's Awards by the Sheriff's Department for his "exceptional service."

Jeremiah was a loving husband to his wife Lynette and devoted father to his step-daughter Kaitlyn and son Cayden. He was a son, brother, and friend whose memory and selfless spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.

Born April 9, 1978, Michael was raised in the Riverside area and graduated from Redlands High School in 1996. Enlisting in the United States Marine Corps, he served two deployment tours in Kuwait as a rifleman in the 15th Marine Expeditionary Unit, 3rd Battalion 1st Marines. During his Military service, he was awarded a Certificate of Commendation, Good Conduct Medal, Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon with one star, and a Rifle Marksmanship Badge.

Sworn in as a Riverside Police Officer on August 24, 2001, Michael was assigned to Field Operations as a Patrol Officer. During his 11-year tenure with the Riverside Police Department, he served as a Patrol Officer, Helicopter Observer, Field Training Officer, and Firearms Instructor. He was also assigned to the Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) Team and the University Neighborhood Enhancement Team (UNET).

A loving husband to his wife Regina and devoted father to his son Ian and daughter Kaitlyn, Michael enjoyed attending dance recitals with his daughter and coaching his son's baseball team. His memory and selfless spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be dearly missed.

During the 1950's and 1960's, he photographed celebrated events of integration in the South, Rosa Parks' bus ride, and a young Elvis Presley shipping off to the Army.

After moving to the Coachella Valley in 1990, Donald became an instrumental force in the community through his philanthropic efforts, including his pledge of \$3.5 million to COD in 2006. For his work in documenting the "Invasion of Normandy" and his services to France, he was awarded the Legion d'Honneur in 2007, the highest honor given by the French Republic.

Donald was a true humanitarian whose memory and passionate spirit will live forever in the hearts of those who knew and loved him. He will be greatly missed.

Born December 7, 1917 in Douglas, Arizona, Russell and his family relocated to Riverside in 1927, where he attended Lowell Elementary, Poly High, and RCC. Following graduation, he was employed as a draftsman for the "noted" architect G. Stanley Wilson and then moved to Los Angeles to work for a large architectural firm. After serving as a Lieutenant in the Navy Seabees during World War II, he returned to Riverside to work with his father. Forming the partnership L.A. Walling & Son, they built many homes in the Wood Streets and the first exclusive custom tract homes in Riverside, Prince Albert Estates. In the mid-1950's, he founded Russell Walling, Inc. and continued residential building along with many large commercial projects including A&W Rootbeer on University Avenue, DeAnza Chevrolet, Caddock Electronics, and Johnson Tractor. His "proudest accomplishment" was the construction of Bourns Incorporated, which won a national award for Building of the Year in 1962. In the early 1970's, he built the first private upscale condominiums on Victoria Avenue, Los Amigos, and in the late 1970's, he purchased the original Security Pacific Bank building, which is now known as the Walling Building.

An active participant in the community, Russell was President of the Riverside Chamber of Commerce, President of the Riverside Rotary Club, President of the Community Hospital Board, Citizen of the Year, and prominent member of the Victoria Club. He also loved the outdoors, golfing, travelling, fishing, and spending quality time with his family.
