Born on September 23, 1916 and raised in Alhambra, Bill came to Temecula with his father in the 1920's to work on a cattle drive. Graduating from Alhambra High School in 1935, he earned his Business Administration Degree from Pasadena Junior College and was hired by an aircraft manufacturing plant in Los Angeles. In 1940, he married his high school sweetheart, Virginia Bosch, and they had three children.

During World War II, he taught workers how to build aircraft for the Navy, and when the war ended, he bought a home in Temple City and was hired by Hughes Aircraft, where he worked for 25 years. In 1959, he became involved in the effort to incorporate Temple City and was elected to the City Council, serving for eight years, including two terms as Mayor.

When his wife Virginia died in 1972, Bill married Evelyn Taylor who was also involved in many local activities. In the mid-1970's, they retired and bought a ranch east of Temecula, where they grew grapefruit, raised livestock, and had a bait worm business called "Wiggler Hollow." After joining the Temecula Chamber of Commerce and the Temecula Town Association, which is dedicated to preserving Temecula's heritage, Bill started a magazine called "Country Life," which led to him becoming publisher of the "High Country" monthly magazine and then managing editor of a weekly newspaper, the "Rancho News."

In 1981, Bill was named Executive Director of the Temecula Valley Chamber of Commerce, and in 1999, he was honored with their "Lifetime Achievement Award." Bill and Evelyn were among the first honorees to have their names inscribed on the City of Temecula's Wall of Fame, and for his many years of service to the community, the Temecula City Council declared March 10, 2009 to be "Bill Harker Day."

As an 18-year-old from Jalisco, Mexico, Jesus came to the United States in the Mid-1950's under a federal program which allowed permanent work visas for Mexican immigrant laborers. While working at numerous farms in and around the Inland Empire, he settled in Corona with his family and purchased a home with 2.5 acres. In the mid-1970's, his real "American Dream" story began when he traded some tools for a pregnant pig that was used to start a successful hog farm which led to the opening of the first Cardenas Market in 1981. The 4,000-square-foot store in Ontario that sold meats and ethnic foods grew into a chain of 29 supermarkets in San Bernardino, Riverside, Los Angeles, and Imperial Counties, including three locations in Las Vegas.
