BACKGROUND (Continued): VFA grant funding is being made available to fire stations in rural areas with populations of 10,000 or less through the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978. The grant has a 50/50 cost share requirement as follows: 50% Federal (\$20,000), and 50% non-Federal (\$20,000), for a total budget of \$40,000. RCFD's portion of the cost share will be covered by general fund dollars budgeted in FY 13-14 per the requirements of the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.

If the grant is award, the department will return to the Board for funding approval per Board policy A-30.
