Everett Lee Spriggs

Obituary



EVERETT LEE SPRIGGS Born July 30, 1930, to Claude E. and Evelyn (Lee) Spriggs, in Safford, Arizona, went to heaven April 23, 2013, at Riverside Community Hospital. He is survived by his wife of almost 60 years, Betty; his three children, Claudia of Dublin, Ohio; and sons Lee and Scott (Lori), both of Riverside. He is also survived by five

grandchildren, Lindsay, Reid and Kylie Reynolds and Hayden and Chandlor Spriggs. He is also survived by his sister Virginia Boyer (Bill); niece Dena Sepulveda and nephew Steven Herder, all of Vista, California, as well as many cousins in Arizona and his loving caregivers, Janet, Angelica, Ann, Laurie and Jasmine. Special thanks to Dr. Andro Sherobiem for his dedicated care of Everett and our family. Everett was always bigger than life and commanded immediate respect and attention simply by entering a crowded room. Everett graduated from high school in Thatcher, Arizona, after which he served in the U.S. Army during the Korean conflict and survived being a Prisoner of War (weighing only 97 pounds at the time of his rescue). Everett and Betty were married August 22, 1953, in Phoenix, Arizona. He then attended and graduated from [Arizona State University](#) and from the University of Arizona School of Law in Tucson. Immediately following graduation, they moved to Los Angeles where he served as a prosecutor with the L.A. City Attorney's office. In 1960 he became an associate with the law firm where he later became a partner, Kinkle, Rodiger and Spriggs and served as president of the firm for many years. He retired from practice in January, 1998. Everett loved his country and was proud to be an American. He had many varied interests. He was an Advocate with the American Board of Trial Advocates (ABOTA). In addition to being a member of the American Bar Association, the California Bar Association, Riverside County Bar Association and Los Angeles County Bar Association, he was admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court. He was a member of Defense Orientation Conference Association (DOCA), a national association supporting our military and the American way of life. Traveling with DOCA he visited many national and foreign military bases and our embassies throughout the world. In addition to his travels with DOCA, he and Betty traveled extensively, visiting numerous countries throughout the world, some of which were mainland China, Republic of South Africa, Morocco and many Central American, South American, European and Asian countries. Everett served several terms as President of the Riverside Philharmonic, ensuring the survival of the Philharmonic, financially and hiring beloved conductor Patrick Flynn. He also served on the Board of the American Heart Association, and was a member of the American Legion. He was a founding member of Mission Bank and later served as Chairman of the Board of Riverside National Bank. He was a member of the Victoria Club (where he had his special table in the dining room), Balboa Bay Club and Shark Island Yacht Club. He loved his dogs, George, Jackie and Lucy, and was proud of his collection of cars and boats. He was an avid foodie, and loved to deep sea fish in the Gulf of California. For many years he organized and led an annual trip with friends to San Felipe, Baja, which became known as the Go Baja Bunch. He will be missed so much. It is going to be very difficult to adjust to the fact that he is no longer physically with us. However, his love and spirit live on. His comforting final words were to Betty - "Hi, Babe". 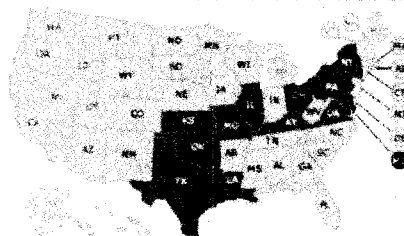

Legendary Hollywood car customizer Dean Jeffries dead at 80

Dean Jeffries, the legendary car painter and customizer who made the Monkeemobile and the Green Hornet's original Black Beauty, died in his sleep Saturday at his home in Hollywood. He was 80.

His death was confirmed by his son, Kevin.

During the car-crazy 1950s in Southern California, Jeffries was one of the first hot-rodders to chop, channel and soup-up automobiles. His distinctive paint jobs and sculpted body work attracted many admirers to his auto shop, including the likes of James Dean, Steve McQueen and A.J. Foyt.

In his career, Jeffries was an automotive jack-of-all-trades, working as a stunt driver, car builder, race car painter and pinstriper. He was well-known within the auto business, but didn't achieve wide commercial success like some of his contemporaries.

"He didn't talk about himself or promote his work," said comedian and car enthusiast Jay Leno, the "Tonight Show" host. "We work in a town where the squeaky wheel gets the grease. That wasn't Dean. He's just a regular car guy who happened to create some of the most gorgeous cars you have ever seen."

He was born Edward Dean Jeffries in 1933 in Osage, Iowa. Soon after, the family moved to the Compton area, where his father was a mechanic.

Jeffries served a stint in the U.S. Army during the Korean War. Upon returning, like many former soldiers in Southern California, he utilized his newly acquired mechanical skills on cars.

Jeffries rented space from the "King of Kustom" George Barris' shop in Compton, working alongside the father of modern pinstriping, Kenneth Howard, who was better known as Von Dutch. The duo were branded as Von Dutch and "The Kid."

It was during this time in 1955 that Jeffries painted the number "130" and "Little Bastard" on James Dean's Porsche 550 Spyder. Dean and Jeffries became friends because of their shared love of cars.

Less than a month later, the Spyder was found wrecked at the junction of routes 466 and 41 near Paso Robles. Dean, who was behind the wheel, was killed.

Jeffries later moved to Sunset Boulevard in Hollywood, then to his long-time shop on Cahuenga Boulevard in North Hollywood, which remains to this day.

His first major success was in the 1964 Grand National Roadster Show with his asymmetrically styled Mantaray, which featured a Maserati Grand Prix chassis and a Cobra engine.

Jeffries created the sleek Black Beauty from a 1966 Chrysler Imperial for the "Green Hornet" TV series. The Monkeemobile, a modified 1966 Pontiac GTO convertible, was built in just 10 days for "The Monkees" TV show.

Later in his career, Jeffries was involved in movie production as a car builder, stunt driver and stunt producer.

"If he was born in France, he probably would have been a painter. But because he was in Southern California, the medium he used was on four wheels," said Tom Cotter, who wrote Jeffries' biography, "Dean Jeffries: 50 Fabulous Years in Hot Rods, Racing & Film."

Jeffries loved the Indianapolis 500 and worked on driver Foyt's crew. One year, after racers caught a glimpse of the paint job he'd given Foyt's car, he ended up painting 22 of the 33 starters in the Indy 500 field.

In his recent years, Jeffries could occasionally be found as a special guest at car shows across the country. He had also been working to make his shop on Cahuenga into a museum of sorts by restoring his personal car collection and meeting with old friends.

Jeffries is survived by his sister Evonne and son Kevin Dean Jeffries of Lake Elsinore. A post on Jeffries' website said a public celebration of Jeffries' life would occur in late May.
