



SUBJECT: 29th Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest. All Districts

BACKGROUND (CONT'D):

Department of Mental Health - Substance Abuse Program requests that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors formally recognize the 29th Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest. The theme of this year's contest is, "The Best Me is Drug Free." The purpose of this contest is to give Riverside County students an opportunity to artistically depict the ways in which they can enjoy life without using drugs. This contest provides the students with peers who serve as positive role models, by setting good examples and encouraging others to look at drug-free alternatives.

In January 2013, Riverside County students who attend public, private and parochial schools, representing grades Kindergarten - 12, were invited to enter the Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster contest in one of the following categories: grades Kindergarten - 2, grades 3 - 5, grades 6 - 8, and grades 9-12. All entries were judged on originality, neatness, most persuasive use of theme, and how well the entry conveyed the message to others. All contest participants received a certificate for their participation. First place winners in each category receive an engraved plaque. The event was co-sponsored by the Riverside County Department of Mental Health - Substance Abuse Program and the Riverside County Office of Education.

Therefore, the Riverside County Department of Mental Health - Substance Abuse Program requests that the Riverside County Board of Supervisors formally recognize the 29th Annual Carol Addiss Student Drug Use Prevention Poster Contest winners and present the awards to the four (4) First Place winners in each category.
