SUBJECT: Approval of the FY 2012-13 Operating and Financial

RECOMMENDED MOTION: Move that the Board of Supervisors approve the FY 2012-13 Operating and Financial Plans, Exhibits A and B, pursuant to the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Forest Service and authorize the Chairperson and Sheriff to sign all copies of the documents.

BACKGROUND: On July 26, 2011 (3.70), the Forest Service and the Sheriff's Department renewed their Cooperative Agreement with a term extending until December 31, 2014. The Agreement provides for law enforcement patrols in the Cleveland and San Bernardino National Forest. Each year, the Sheriff and the Forest Service execute Operating and Financial Plans pursuant to this Agreement.

Under the FY 2012-13 Annual Operating and Financial Plan-Exhibit A, Sheriff's Deputies from the Hemet and Lake Elsinore Sheriff's stations will conduct patrols on National Forest System lands, as necessary. The operating budget shall not exceed \$15,000.

Under the FY 2012-13 Controlled Substance Annual Operating and Financial Plan-Exhibit B, the Sheriff's Department will be reimbursed up to \$20,000 for detection and investigation of persons producing or trafficking controlled substances on National Forest System lands.

All patrols provided pursuant to these Plans are conducted on Overtime. All costs for the service are recovered at Board-approved rates. The term of each Plan is from October 1, 2012 to September 30, 2013. County Counsel has approved the Master Cooperative Agreement and the Operating and Financial Plans as to form.

B. Reimbursement for all types of enforcement activities shall be at the following rates unless specifically stated otherwise:

.85/mile patrolled. Per diem rate is N/A/day. Wages at the prevailing wage rate of \$91.71/hour plus fringe benefits for the individual officer at the rate of: NA/hour.

II. PATROL ACTIVITIES:

- A. Time schedules for patrols will be flexible to allow for emergencies, other priorities, and day-to-day needs of both the Cooperator and the U.S. Forest Service. Ample time will be spent in each area to make residents and visitors aware that law enforcement officers are in the vicinity.
 - Patrol on the following Forest Service roads:



The Patrol Captain will determine designated patrol activities and locations for the rural areas of the Cleveland and San Bernardino National Forests. The Patrol Captain or designee shall make requests for personnel to the County. Personnel assigned to these details shall be Deputies, Reserve Deputies or Sergeants normally assigned to the Patrol Division.

•Patrol in the following campgrounds, developed sites, or dispersed areas:

The Patrol Captain will determine designated patrol activities and locations for the rural areas of the Cleveland National Forest.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: \$14,000.00

III. TRAINING:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-K for additional information.

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: 10% of the total Agreement and shall be approved by the Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative).

Total reimbursement for training may not exceed: \$1,000.00

IV. EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions IV-K, IV-L, and IV-M for additional information.

(If purchase is determined necessary, document the need for such a determination and make the documentation part of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreements' official file)

Total reimbursement for this category shall not exceed the amount of: 10% of the total Agreement, or by authorization of the Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative) if greater expenditures are necessary. All expenditures in this category shall be approved by the Forest Service (Designated Representative or Alternate Representative). The estimated useful life of the equipment under the law enforcement agreement provisions IV-J and IV-D (5) shall be provided at the time the documents are filed.

Total reimbursement for equipment shall not exceed: (10% of the total amount)

Total reimbursement for patrol activities, including training and equipment described below, shall not exceed the amount of \$15,000.00



V. SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT SITUATIONS:

- A. Special Enforcement Situations include but are not limited to: Fire Emergencies, Drug Enforcement, and certain Group Gatherings.
- B. Funds available for special enforcement situations vary greatly from year to year and must be specifically requested and approved prior to any reimbursement being authorized. Requests for funds should be made to the U.S. Forest Service designated representative listed in Item I-A of this Annual Operating Plan. The designated representative will then notify Cooperator whether funds will be authorized for reimbursement. If funds are authorized, the parties will then jointly prepare a revised Annual Operating Plan.
 - Drug Enforcement: This will be handled on a case by case basis. The request will
 normally come from the patrol Captain; however, it may come from the Special
 Agent in Charge or their designated representative. Reimbursement shall be made
 at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to the incident will
 coordinate all of their activities with the designated officer in charge of the
 incident.
 - 2. Fire Emergency: During emergency fire suppression situations and upon request by the Forest Service pursuant to an incident resource order, the Cooperator agrees to provide special services beyond those provided under Section II-A, within the Cooperator's resource capabilities, for the enforcement of State and local laws related to the protection of persons and their property. The Cooperator will be compensated at the rate specified in Section I-B; the Forest Service will specify times and schedules. Upon concurrence of the local patrol Captain or their designated representative, an official from the Incident Management Team managing the incident, Cooperator personnel assigned to an incident where meals are provided will be entitled to such meals.
 - 3. Group Gatherings: This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notices, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organization rendezvous. Upon authorization by a Forest Service representative listed in Section I-A for requested services of this nature, reimbursement shall be made at the rates specified in Section I-B. Deputies assigned to this type of incident will normally coordinate their activities with the designated officer in charge of the incident.

This includes but is not limited to situations which are normally unanticipated or which typically include very short notice, large group gatherings such as rock concerts, demonstrations, and organizational rendezvous.



VI. BILLING FREQUENCY:

See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provisions II-H and III-B for additional information.

The Cooperator will furnish the Forest Service with itemized monthly statements for expenditures. The statement shall be in sufficient detail to allow the Forest Service to tie these expenditures back to reimbursable expenses and the rate schedule and shall be certified by the County of Riverside as being current and proper. These statements must be accompanied by a Law Enforcement Activity Report, form FS-5300-5, filled out as required by Provision 11-G of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement 11-LE-11051360-230.

II. CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OPERATIONS

Pursuant to IV- I of Agreement No. 11-LE-11051360-230, the following is in support of operations to suppress manufacturing and trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest System lands, with an emphasis on identification, apprehension and prosecution of suspects engaged in these activities:

A. The U.S. Forest Service agrees:

1. To reimburse <u>RCS</u> for expenditures associated with the detection of locations and activities related to illegal production and trafficking of controlled substances, including;



- a. Ground reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- b. Aerial reconnaissance to identify and inventory locations and activities associated with producing or trafficking controlled substances. Reconnaissance shall be performed using a U.S. Forest Service approved aircraft with a minimum of one U.S. Forest Service observer on board, unless waived by the U.S. Forest Service.
- 2. To reimburse <u>RCS</u> for certain expenses resulting from investigative activities associated with investigating cases involving the illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances on or affecting the administration of National Forest system lands, including:
 - a. Surveillance operations to identify persons illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - b. Apprehension of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - c. Collection of evidence to support prosecution of persons suspected of illegally producing or trafficking controlled substances.
 - d. Prosecution of persons suspected of producing or trafficking controlled substances.
- 3. To reimburse <u>RCS</u> for expenses resulting from the removal of cannabis plants from National Forest System lands. When circumstances indicate that removal of the cannabis plants is required before an investigation to determine the person(s) responsible can be completed, eradication operations must be approved by the U.S. Forest Service prior to taking place.

Note: <u>RCS</u> retains the authority to eradicate cannabis plants from National Forest System lands without reimbursement from the U.S. Forest Service at its discretion.

4. To reimburse <u>RCS</u> for the costs of purchasing supplies and equipment used exclusively for activities described in items A.1, A.2 and A.3 of this Plan. Purchases must be agreed to and approved by the U.S. Forest Service.

Purchases may not exceed 10% of the total allocation without prior approval by the U.S. Forest Service Designated Representative.

B. RCS agrees:

- 1. Within its capability, to perform the following activities on National Forest System lands:
 - a. Detect and inventory locations associated with illegal production or trafficking of controlled substances, and notify the U.S. Forest Service of such locations as soon as possible.



- b. Investigations to determine the person(s) responsible for manufacturing or trafficking controlled substances.
- c. Upon request and prior approval of the U.S. Forest Service, remove cannabis plants from National Forest System lands.
- 2. To furnish all activity reports, crime reports, investigation reports, and other reports or records, resulting from activities identified in **Section II**, **A** of this Operating and Financial Plan to the affected Forests for review and forwarding to the Regional Office for processing.
- C. The U.S. Forest Service and RCS mutually agree to the following:
 - 1. The following rate schedule will apply to all expenditures that may be reimbursed to <u>RCS</u> under this agreement;

- 2. The total expenditures of <u>RCS</u> that may be reimbursed may not exceed.... \$20,000.00. The total expenditures for item A.4 may not exceed..... 10% of the total allocation.
- D. Any remaining funding in this Annual Operating Plan may be carried forward to the next fiscal year and will be available to spend through the term of the Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement, or de-obligated at the request of the U.S. Forest Service. See Cooperative Law Enforcement Agreement Provision IV-V.
