BACKGROUND:

The Transportation Department currently provides ongoing professional services to the CITY for engineering and maintenance of the CITY road system. The CITY has requested that the COUNTY continue providing these services.

The Transportation Department staff is very familiar with the road system within the CITY and is able to provide the necessary services in a cost-effective manner. The Transportation Department has the depth of experience and the personnel to assist the CITY on an on-call basis. The services include, but are not limited to, routine traffic signal maintenance, landscape maintenance, and engineering services to deliver capital projects on a case-by-case basis as may be requested by the CITY. The CITY will perform regular street maintenance work and will utilize the COUNTY as needed for extraordinary or emergency work. The level of service and priorities would be determined by the CITY, and Transportation Department staff would serve as an extension of, and work at the direction of, the CITY engineering staff at the sole expense of the CITY.

The Jurupa Valley City Council approved the agreement on June 20, 2013.

This agreement is for a term of two years, terminating June 30, 2015.

**AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES
BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE
AND THE CITY OF JURUPA VALLEY
FY 2013-2014**

The County of Riverside, California (hereinafter "COUNTY"), and the City of Jurupa Valley, California (hereinafter "CITY"), hereby agree as follows:

RECITALS

- A. CITY desires that the COUNTY, through the Transportation Department, provide, upon request, certain professional services for CITY. Services by other COUNTY departments or agencies are not the subject of this Agreement.
- B. COUNTY and CITY desire to define herein the scope of the professional services to be provided and the terms and conditions pursuant to which COUNTY will provide the professional services.

NOW THEREFORE, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

SECTION 1 - RECITALS INCORPORATED

The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and made a part of this Agreement by this reference.

SECTION 2 - ADMINISTRATION

The Director of Transportation and Land Management, or his designee, shall administer this Agreement on behalf of COUNTY (hereinafter "COUNTY'S contract administrator"). The CITY Manager, or his designee, shall administer this Agreement on behalf of CITY (hereinafter "CITY'S contract administrator").

1 SECTION 3 - SCOPE OF SERVICES

2 Upon CITY'S request and COUNTY'S approval as set forth herein, COUNTY will provide the
3 professional services described in Attachment A-1 to this Agreement. The parties may agree
4 that COUNTY will provide additional professional services to CITY upon mutual agreement of
5 the scope of such additional services and the costs therefore. Such agreement for additional
6 services will be memorialized in writing and signed by the respective parties' contract
7 administrators and added to this Agreement as additional Attachments (i.e., A-2, A-3) as
8 needed. . COUNTY shall comply with all CITY codes, ordinances, resolutions, regulations and
9 policies (hereinafter "City codes") in providing the professional services. COUNTY shall work
10 directly with CITY and its staff in providing the professional services and COUNTY staff shall
11 consult with CITY staff if CITY staff desires such consultation. COUNTY shall not be required to,
12 and shall not, respond to any person or entity other than CITY concerning the professional
13 services it provides. CITY shall be responsible for responding to all such persons or entities as
14 set forth herein.

15
16 SECTION 4 - REQUESTS FOR SERVICES

17 CITY may request professional services for a single project or program or a group or class of
18 projects or programs. CITY shall make all requests for professional services in writing and
19 CITY'S contract administrator, or his designee shall send such requests to COUNTY'S contract
20 administrator, or his designee. Before requesting professional services, CITY'S contract
21 administrator may ask COUNTY'S contract administrator for a written estimate of the cost of the
22 services and any established procedure COUNTY may have for providing the services
23 (hereinafter "service delivery procedure").

24
25 SECTION 5 - APPROVAL OF REQUESTS

26 If COUNTY agrees to provide the professional services requested, COUNTY'S contract
27 administrator shall notify CITY'S contract administrator in writing. The written notification to CITY
28 shall include the service delivery procedure, if necessary or requested by CITY. Services shall
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1 be provided in accordance with the service delivery procedure unless the parties mutually agree
2 to a different procedure. Except as provided in Section 6. of this Agreement, COUNTY shall not
3 provide professional services if the request for such services is not made and approved in the
4 manner described above.
5

6 **SECTION 6 - DANGEROUS CONDITION EXCEPTION**

7 Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 4. and 5. of this Agreement, COUNTY is hereby
8 authorized to immediately remedy any dangerous condition it encounters in the course of
9 providing professional services, and CITY hereby agrees to pay the reasonable costs incurred
10 by COUNTY for such remediation. For purposes of this Agreement, a dangerous condition shall
11 be any condition that may result in imminent personal injury or property damage. If COUNTY
12 encounters a dangerous condition, COUNTY shall notify CITY'S contract administrator as soon
13 as practical to do so.
14

15 **SECTION 7 - PERTINENT INFORMATION**

16 Once a request for professional services has been made and approved in the manner described
17 in Sections 4 and 5 above, CITY'S contract administrator shall transmit to COUNTY'S contract
18 administrator all pertinent information concerning the project or program or group or class of
19 projects or programs.
20

21 **SECTION 8 – INSPECTION, REJECTION AND ACCEPTANCE OF SERVICES**

22 CITY may inspect COUNTY'S work performed pursuant to this Agreement while the work is
23 being performed or after it has been completed. CITY may reject COUNTY'S work no later than
24 thirty (30) days after the work has been completed by submitting to COUNTY'S contract
25 administrator a written explanation of the reasons for the rejection. If CITY does not reject
26 COUNTY'S work as provided above, CITY shall be deemed to have accepted COUNTY'S work.
27 CITY'S acceptance shall be conclusive as to such work except with respect to latent defects,
28 fraud and such gross mistakes as amount to fraud. CITY'S acceptance shall not constitute a
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1 waiver of any of the provisions of this Agreement including, but not limited to, the sections
2 pertaining to indemnification and insurance.
3

4 SECTION 9 - PERSONNEL

5 In providing the professional services described in this Agreement, COUNTY and its staff shall
6 be considered independent contractors and shall not be considered CITY employees for any
7 purpose. COUNTY staff shall at all times be under COUNTY'S exclusive direction and control
8 and shall be located at COUNTY facilities. Neither CITY, its officials, officers, employees or
9 agents, shall have control over the conduct of COUNTY or any of COUNTY'S officials, officers,
10 employees, or agents except as set forth in this Agreement. COUNTY shall have no authority to
11 bind CITY in any manner, or to incur any obligation, debt or liability of any kind on behalf of or
12 against CITY, whether by contract or otherwise, unless such authority is expressly conferred by
13 this Agreement or is otherwise expressly conferred by CITY in writing. COUNTY shall not at any
14 time or in any manner represent that COUNTY or any of COUNTY'S officials, officers,
15 employees or agents are in any manner officials, officers, employees or agents of CITY.
16 COUNTY shall pay all wages, salaries and other amounts due its personnel in connection with
17 their provision of the professional services and as required by law. Neither COUNTY, nor any of
18 COUNTY'S officials, officers, employees or agents, shall obtain any rights to retirement, health
19 care or any other benefits which may otherwise accrue to CITY'S employees. COUNTY
20 expressly waives any claim COUNTY may have to any such rights.
21

22 SECTION 10 - VEHICLES

23 If CITY chooses to provide vehicles for COUNTY'S use in providing professional services, the
24 vehicles shall meet COUNTY'S specifications, shall be adequately equipped and ready for
25 service and shall be registered in the name of CITY. CITY-owned vehicles shall only be used for
26 CITY-approved functions. CITY shall also pay COUNTY the full costs of operating such
27 vehicles, including, but not limited to, fuel, maintenance, and licensing costs. Unless otherwise
28 directed in writing by CITY, COUNTY shall provide all vehicle and equipment necessary to
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1 provide services requested by CITY.
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3 **SECTION 11 - COST OF SERVICES**

4 Unless the parties have mutually agreed in writing to a set fee for professional services as
5 provided in Section 3. of this Agreement, CITY shall pay COUNTY for all such services,
6 including staff-to-staff consultations, at the hourly rates set forth in Attachment B to this
7 Agreement. CITY shall pay COUNTY for each hour of services it provides, or each fraction of an
8 hour billed at 1/10th increments, including any required travel time. Work done by the COUNTY
9 after regular working hours, such as responding to emergency calls, shall be paid at 1.5 times
10 the hourly labor rate component as shown in Attachment B. CITY shall not pay COUNTY for
11 any professional services not described in Attachment A-1 to this Agreement, unless those
12 services have been mutually agreed to in writing as provided in Section 3. of this Agreement.
13

14 **SECTION 12 - BILLING**

15 COUNTY'S contract administrator shall submit to CITY'S contract administrator a monthly
16 invoice which shall include an itemized accounting of all services performed and the cost
17 thereof.
18

19 **SECTION 13 - PAYMENTS**

20 CITY shall pay each monthly invoice within thirty (30) days of the date CITY'S contract
21 administrator receives the invoice from COUNTY'S contract administrator. CITY may dispute
22 any monthly invoice by submitting a written description of the dispute to COUNTY'S contract
23 administrator within ten (10) days of the date CITY'S contract administrator receives the invoice
24 from COUNTY'S contract administrator. CITY may defer the payment of any portion of the
25 invoice in dispute until such time as the dispute is resolved; however, all portions of the invoice
26 not in dispute must be paid within the thirty (30)-day period set forth herein.
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1 SECTION 14 – RECORD MAINTENANCE

2 COUNTY shall maintain all documents and records relating to the professional services provided
3 pursuant to this Agreement, including, but not limited to, any and all ledgers, books of account,
4 invoices, vouchers, canceled checks, and other expenditure or disbursement documents. Such
5 documents and records shall be maintained in accordance with generally accepted accounting
6 principles and shall be sufficiently complete and detailed so as to permit an accurate evaluation
7 of the professional services provided by COUNTY pursuant to this Agreement. Such documents
8 and records shall be maintained for three years from the date of execution of this Agreement
9 and to the extent required by laws relating to public agency audits and expenditures.
10

11 SECTION 15 – RECORD INSPECTION

12 All documents and records required to be maintained pursuant to Section 14. of this Agreement
13 shall be made available for inspection, audit and copying, at any time during regular business
14 hours, upon the request of CITY'S contract administrator. Copies of such documents or records
15 shall be provided directly to CITY'S contract administrator for inspection, audit and copying when
16 it is practical to do so; otherwise, such documents and records shall be made available at
17 COUNTY'S address specified in Section 19. of this Agreement.
18

19 SECTION 16 - DUTY TO INFORM AND RESPOND

20 CITY'S contract administrator shall promptly transmit to COUNTY'S contract administrator all
21 inquiries, complaints, and correspondence that CITY receives concerning COUNTY'S
22 professional services and all information concerning dangerous conditions that CITY'S contract
23 administrator either knows or should know exist. COUNTY'S contract administrator shall
24 promptly transmit to CITY'S contract administrator all inquiries, complaints, and correspondence
25 that COUNTY receives in the course of providing professional services. CITY shall be
26 responsible for responding to all such inquiries, complaints and correspondence.
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SECTION 17 – STANDARD OF PERFORMANCE

COUNTY represents and warrants that it has the qualifications, experience and facilities necessary to properly perform the professional services described in this Agreement and that it will perform such services competently. In meeting its obligations under this Agreement, COUNTY shall employ, at a minimum, generally accepted standards and practices utilized by persons engaged in providing services similar to those required of COUNTY under this Agreement.

SECTION 18 – PERMITS AND LICENSES

COUNTY shall obtain any and all permits, licenses and authorizations necessary to perform the professional services described in this Agreement. Neither CITY, not its officials, officers, employees or agents shall be liable, at law or in equity, as a result of COUNTY’S failure to comply with this section.

SECTION 19 - NOTICES

Any notices required or permitted to be sent to either party shall be deemed given when personally delivered to the individuals identified below or when addressed as follows and deposited in the U.S. Mail, postage prepaid:

1 SECTION 20 - OWNERSHIP OF DATA

2 Ownership and title to all reports, documents, plans, specifications, and estimates produced or
3 compiled pursuant to this Agreement shall automatically be vested in CITY and become the
4 property of CITY. CITY reserves the right to authorize others to use or reproduce such materials
5 and COUNTY shall not circulate such materials, in whole or in part, or release such materials to
6 any person or entity other than CITY without the authorization of CITY'S contract administrator.
7

8 SECTION 21 - CONFIDENTIALITY

9 COUNTY shall observe all Federal and State regulations concerning the confidentiality of
10 records. All information gained or work product produced by COUNTY pursuant to this
11 Agreement shall be considered confidential, unless such information is in the public domain.
12 COUNTY'S contract administrator shall promptly notify CITY'S contract administrator when
13 COUNTY receives a request for release or disclosure of information or work product. COUNTY
14 shall not release or disclose information or work product to persons or entities other than CITY
15 without prior written authorization from CITY'S contract administrator, except when such release
16 or disclosure is required by the California Public Records Act or any other law.
17

18 SECTION 22 - INDEMNIFICATION

19 Indemnification by COUNTY. Excepted as provided below in the paragraph entitled "Special
20 Circumstances", COUNTY shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless CITY, its officials, officers,
21 employees and agents from all claims and liability for loss, damage, or injury to property or
22 persons, including wrongful death, based on COUNTY'S negligent acts, omissions or willful
23 misconduct arising out of or in connection with the performance of professional services under
24 this Agreement including, without limitation, the payment of attorney's fees.

25 Indemnification by CITY. CITY shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless COUNTY, its
26 officials, officers, employees and agents from all claims and liability for loss, damage, or injury to
27 property or persons, including wrongful death, based on CITY'S negligent acts, omissions or
28 willful misconduct arising out of or in connection with the performance of professional services
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1 under this Agreement including, without limitation, the payment of attorney's fees.

2 Special Circumstances. Notwithstanding the above, COUNTY shall not indemnify, defend and
3 hold harmless CITY, its officials, officers, employees and agents, and CITY shall indemnify,
4 defend, and hold harmless COUNTY its officials, officers, employees and agents, from all claims
5 and liability resulting from any of the following:

- 6 1. The invalidity of CITY'S codes, ordinances, or regulations
- 7 2. How CITY decides to maintain, or prioritize the maintenance of, CITY facilities,
8 including, but not limited to, streets and sidewalks.
- 9 3. How CITY decides to deploy, or prioritize the deployment of, school crossing guards.
- 10 4. The design of CITY facilities, including, but not limited to, streets and sidewalks.
- 11 5. CITY'S failure to provide pertinent information and inform as provided in Sections 7.
12 and 16. of this Agreement.
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15 Notification and Cooperation. The parties mutually agree to notify each other through their
16 respective contract administrators if they are served with any claims, summons, complaint,
17 discovery request or court order (hereinafter "litigation documents") concerning this Agreement
18 and the professional services provided hereunder. The parties also mutually agree to cooperate
19 with each other in any third party legal action concerning this Agreement and the professional
20 services provided hereunder. Such cooperation shall include each party giving the other an
21 opportunity to review any proposed responses to litigation documents. This right of review does
22 not, however, give either party the right to control, direct or rewrite the proposed responses of
23 the other party.

24 SECTION 23 - INSURANCE

25 The parties agree to maintain the types of insurance and liability limits that are expected for
26 entities of their size and diversity. The types of insurance maintained and the limits of liability for
27 each insurance type shall not limit the indemnification provided by each party to the other. If
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1 CITY chooses to provide vehicles for COUNTY'S use, CITY shall maintain liability insurance for
2 the CITY-owned vehicles and insurance for any physical damage to the CITY-owned vehicles in
3 an amount equal to the replacement value of all vehicles provided. The vehicle policies shall, by
4 endorsement, name COUNTY, its agencies and departments and their respective officials,
5 officers, employees and agents as additional insureds.
6

7 **SECTION 24 – ASSIGNMENT**

8 The expertise and experience of COUNTY are material considerations for this Agreement. CITY
9 has an interest in the qualifications and capabilities of the persons and entities that COUNTY will
10 use to fulfill its obligations under this Agreement. In recognition of that interest, COUNTY shall
11 not assign or transfer this Agreement, in whole or in part, or the performance of any of
12 COUNTY'S obligations under this Agreement without prior written consent of the CITY'S
13 contract administrator. Any attempted assignment shall be ineffective, null and void, and shall
14 constitute a material breach of this Agreement entitling CITY to any and all remedies at law or in
15 equity, including summary termination of this Agreement. CITY acknowledges, however, that
16 COUNTY, in the performance of its duties under this Agreement, may utilize subcontractors.
17

18 **SECTION 25 - IMMUNITIES**

19 Nothing in this Agreement is intended to nor shall it impair the statutory limitations and/or
20 immunities applicable or available to the parties under State laws and regulations.
21

22 **SECTION 26 - MODIFICATIONS**

23 This Agreement may be amended or modified only by mutual agreement of the parties. No
24 alteration or variation of the terms of this Agreement shall be valid unless made in writing and
25 signed by the parties hereto, and no oral understanding or agreement not incorporated herein
26 shall be binding on any of the parties hereto.
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1 SECTION 27 - WAIVER

2 Any waiver by a party of any breach of one or more of the terms of this Agreement shall not be
3 construed to be a waiver of any subsequent or other breach of the same or of any other term
4 hereof. Failure on the part of either party to require exact, full and complete compliance with any
5 terms of this Agreement shall not be construed as changing in any manner the terms hereof, or
6 estopping that party from enforcing the terms hereof.
7

8 SECTION 28 - SEVERABILITY

9 If any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void
10 or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force without being
11 impaired or invalidated in any way.
12

13 SECTION 29 - TERM

14 This Agreement shall become effective upon its approval by the Riverside County Board of
15 Supervisors and shall remain in effect until June 30, 2015. This agreement may be terminated
16 by either party upon sixty (60) days written notice to the other party. This Agreement may be
17 extended every twelve (12) months, starting on June 30, 2015 if the parties, through their
18 respective governing bodies, mutually agree to the extension in writing and mutually agree on
19 the hourly rate to be charged for services.
20

21 SECTION 30 - ENTIRE AGREEMENT

22 This Agreement is intended by the parties as a final expression of their understanding with
23 respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes any and all prior and contemporaneous
24 agreements and understandings, written or oral.
