SUBJECT: First Amendment to the Loan Agreement between the County of Riverside and the City of Canyon Lake for the Improvements to Railroad Canyon Road

RECOMMENDED MOTION: That the Board of Supervisors:

- 1) Approve the First Amendment to the Loan Agreement between the County of Riverside and the City of Canyon Lake for improvements to Railroad Canyon Road; and
- 2) Approve the Loan Repayment Schedule as described in Attachment A; and
- 3) Direct the Executive Office to administer the loan agreement.

BACKGROUND: On April 29, 2003 (Minute Order 3.39), the Board of Supervisors approved a cash loan in the amount of \$1,000,000 in development agreement funds to the City of Canyon Lake for the improvements to Railroad Canyon Road to be repaid over ten years.

Since the 2003 loan, \$607,983 has been repaid to the County in the form of cash and the transfer of the City's State Park and Community Development Block Grant allocations for the construction of public facilities. The balance of the loan, in the amount of \$392,016.54 was due June 30, 2013. The Board extended this loan due date to August 30, 2013 (Item 3-1 of 6/25/13) to allow the City and County to work out an amendment to the loan agreement.

The City and the County have negotiated an amendment to the loan agreement which will extend the loan term seven (7) years to October 15, 2019. Starting on October 15, 2013, the City will repay the County from its Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) Measure A annual allocation to be used for transportation projects. In addition, a one-time deposit of the City's accumulated K-Rat fee collection will be paid in Year 1.

The loan agreement will ensure that the County is repaid in full within the loan terms. The Executive Office will administer the loan agreement and track the loan payments.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE LOAN AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN THE CITY OF CANYON LAKE AND THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE FOR ROAD IMPROVEMENTS TO RAILROAD CANYON ROAD

This first amendment ("First Amendment") to the loan agreement ("Loan Agreement") is executed on this 201 day of 4000 , 2013, by and between the County of Riverside ("County") and the City of Canyon Lake ("City").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2003 (Item 3.51) the County and City entered into a Loan Agreement in which the County provided a cash loan to the City in the amount of \$1,000,000 from Third District Development Agreement funds to upgrade Railroad Canyon Road, located in the City of Canyon Lake; and

WHEREAS, the terms of the Loan Agreement of May 20, 2003 (Item 3.51) was an interest-free loan to be repaid to the County by the City within ten (10) years of the date of the executed Loan Agreement and no later than June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the City repaid to the Third District Development Agreement fund a cash amount of \$125,917, and transferred to the County \$444,130 of the City's allocations of State Department of Parks and Recreation and Community Development Block Grant funds to expend on parks (Hurkey Creek, McCall and Idyllwild Nature Center) and public facility improvements to benefit the Third District; and

WHEREAS, following the establishment of the new district boundaries that placed the City in the First Supervisorial District, the City authorized the County to expend \$37,936 of the City's Community Development Block Grant allocation for public facility improvements to benefit the First District; and

WHEREAS, a total of \$607,983 has been repaid by the City and expended by the County, leaving the remaining unpaid balance of the City's loan at \$392,017 as of June 30, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to recover the loan balance due the County while assisting the City in its path to financial stability; and

WHEREAS, the County and City have mutually negotiated the loan terms for the unpaid loan balance and the County and City wish to amend the Loan Agreement for repayment of the remaining loan balance;

NOW, THEREFORE, the County and City hereto do mutually agree as follows:

1. Section 1 of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"Purpose:

The purpose of the First Amendment to the Loan Agreement is to outline the terms and conditions by which the City will provide repayment of the balance of the Loan Agreement so that the City can fulfill its financial obligation to the County within the loan terms agreed herein.

City's Agreement:

In consideration of the execution of this First Amendment by the County and City, the City agrees:

- (a) The City shall repay the remaining loan balance of \$392,017 to the County interest-free within seven (7) years of the date of this First Amendment and no later than October 15, 2019, as described in the Loan Repayment Schedule, herein attached as Attachment A.
- (b) The City shall not be subject to any penalty for early payment of any portion or all of the debt due to the County by the City as identified by this Amendment.
- (c) In Year One, the City shall transfer the balance of accumulated K-Rat funds to the County, as listed in the Loan Repayment Schedule per Attachment A.
- (d) In Years One through Five of the Loan Repayment Schedule, as per Attachment A, commencing October 15, 2013, the City shall annually transfer to the County of Riverside the portion of the Measure A funds allocated from the Riverside County Transportation Commission (RCTC) as listed in the Five Year Capital Improvement Plan and executed Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Certification Statement (Attachment B) by and between the City and RCTC.
- (e) In Year Six of the Loan Repayment Schedule, as per Attachment A, commencing October 15, 2018, the City shall transfer to the County of Riverside the portion of the

- estimated Measure A funds allocated from the RCTC from the future Five Year Capital Improvement Plan and MOE.
- (f) At the commencement of Year Six and until the repayment of the loan is made in full, the City has the option of repayment from any other special funds in the event of shortfalls in the Measure A allocation provided that the loan repayment is made in full on or before October 15, 2019.

County's Agreement:

In consideration of the execution of this Amendment by the County and City, the County agrees:

- (a) The County shall accept the portion of the Measure A funds allocated from the RCTC as listed in the Five Year Capital Improvement Plan and executed Maintenance of Effort Certification as repayment for the remaining loan balance of \$392,017, interest-free, within seven (7) years of the date of this amendment, commencing on October 15, 2013.
- (b) The loan repayment amounts shall be deposited into the First District Development
 Agreement Public Facilities Trust Fund. Measure A funds shall be used by the
 County for Transportation purposes in the First Supervisorial District."
- 2. Section 2 of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety
- 3. Section 3 of the Agreement is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:

"Defaults:

The County may accelerate and demand in full, complete and immediate repayment of the complete debt due to the County by the City if:

- (a) the City commits any material breach of this First Amendment and has not cured such material breach within thirty (30) days after the date of receipt of written demand by the County; or
- (b) the City ceases participation in the Riverside County Transportation Commission

 Five Year Capital Improvement Plan; or
- (c) the City becomes ineligible to receive Measure A funds.

1	Remedies:
2	If the City does not cure default within the time specified in Section 2.2 (a) the County shall apply
3	an interest penalty of five percent (5%) annually on the outstanding balance."
4	4. A new subsection 4.5 is added to Section 4 of the Agreement to read as follows:

The Agency hereby acknowledges that the failure of the Agency to continue such local expenditure shall result in a reduction or loss of Measure A funds. Additionally, the Agency commits to expending Measure A Local Streets and Roads funds for projects listed in the Five Year Capital Improvement Plan as approved by Riverside County Transportation Commission.

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FY 2013/14 MOE Certification Statement

The Measure A Ordinance requires annual certification that discretionary General Fund expenditures for transportation-related construction and maintenance activities for Fiscal Year 2013/2014 will meet or exceed the MOE Base Year amount and commitment to expending Measure A Local Street and Roads funds to projects indentified in the agency's Five-Year CIP. Funds withheld from a local agency for failure to meets its MOE Base Year requirement will be redistributed in accordance with Ordinance No. 02-01 within the Measure A area in which the agency is located (Western County, Coachella Valley, or Palo Verde Valley). The MOE Certification Statement (Attachment C) is only required from agencies that were incorporated before July 1, 2009, and have an approved MOE base-year amount.

The MOE Certification Statement is one part of the MOE process. The Commission's auditor will perform agreed-upon procedures related to Measure A following the end of the fiscal year. At that time, the fiscal year's actual MOE expenditures will be compared to the MOE base year and the local agency will be required to provide a summary of that fiscal year's MOE expenditures in a format consistent with the MOE base year format.

Project Status Report

The Commission must also receive a <u>Project Status Report</u> (sample format included as Attachment D) on the FY 2012/2013 CIP projects. The purpose of this report is to document progress to date on engineering, right-of-way acquisition, and construction; problems encountered; and expected completion date.

Submittal Deadlines

The timeline for approval of the Five-Year CIP is as follows:

- Monday, May 13, 2013 Submit the <u>Five-Year CIP</u>, <u>MOE Certification</u>
 <u>Statement, and Project Status Report</u>, Attention: <u>Shirley</u> <u>Medina</u>
- June/July 2013 Commission review and approval of Five-Year CIP
- September 2013 First disbursement of FY 2013/14 Measure A funds

No Measure A disbursements can be made for the fiscal year until the Commission has received and approved a Five-Year CIP and MOE certification. Note that local agencies that incorporate after July 1, 2009, will use the third year after incorporation to determine the MOE base year amount and will submit their first MOE certification statement for the fourth fiscal year after incorporation.
