BACKGROUND:

County Service Area (CSA) 93 was formed in 1972 to operate and maintain park and recreation facilities and services in the Moreno Valley area. The City of Moreno Valley incorporated on December 3, 1984 and assumed the primary service function and responsibilities of CSA 93.

Much of the territory left in CSA 93 is within the Box Springs Mountain Reserve and the Lake Perris Recreation Area and will not be developed. All the developed parks that CSA 93 was formed to provide funding for are now within the boundaries of the City of Moreno Valley. What remains of CSA 93 no longer has any services to provide.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2013-210

A RESOLUTION BY THE COUNTY OF RIVERSIDE REQUESTING THE LOCAL AGENCY FORMATION COMMISSION TO TAKE PROCEEDINGS FOR THE **DISSOLUTION OF CSA 93**

WHEREAS, County Service Area 93 (CSA 93) is deemed to be a special district whose affairs and finances are under the supervision and control of the Board of Supervisors pursuant to California Government Code Section 25214; and

WHEREAS, the Riverside County Board of Supervisors desires to initiate a proposal pursuant to the Cortese-Knox Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000, commencing with Section 56000 of the California Government Code, for the dissolution of CSA 93; and

WHEREAS, notice of intent to adopt this resolution of application has been given to the commission, each interested agency and each subject agency at least 20 days prior to the adoption of this resolution; and

WHEREAS, the territory proposed to be dissolved is inhabited, and a description of the boundaries of the territory is set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and by this reference incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, this proposal is consistent with the sphere of influence of the affected CSA; and is not affected by any other sphere of influence; and

WHEREAS, it is desired to provide that the proposed dissolution of CSA 93 be subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The County of Riverside shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Riverside County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO), its agents, officers, and employees from any claim, action, or proceeding against LAFCO, its agents, officers, or employees to attach, set aside, void, or annul an

approval of LAFCO concerning the dissolution of CSA 93. LAFCO will promptly notify the County of Riverside of any such claim, action, or proceedings against LAFCO and will cooperate fully in the defense. If LAFCO fails to promptly notify the County of Riverside of any such claim, action or proceeding, or fails to cooperate fully in the defense, the County of Riverside shall not, thereafter, be responsible to defend, indemnify, or hold harmless LAFCO.


WHEREAS, CSA 93 has no assets, debts or obligations that remain outstanding; and WHEREAS, the reasons for the proposed dissolution of CSA 93 are as follows: The City of Moreno Valley incorporated on December 3, 1984 and assumed the primary service function and responsibilities of CSA 93. Much of the territory left in CSA 93 is within the Box Springs Mountain Reserve or the Lake Perris Recreation Area and will not be developed. Since all the parks that CSA 93 was formed to provide funding for are within the City of Moreno Valley what remains of CSA 93 no longer has any services to provide; and

WHEREAS, this Board certifies that this action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") review under CEQA Guidelines sections 15320 and 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that the dissolution of CSA 93 will have a significant effect on the environment and because it is a change in the organization or reorganization of a local government agency where the change does not change the geographical area in which the previously existing powers are exercised.

NOW, THEREFORE, this Resolution is hereby adopted and approved by the Riverside County Board of Supervisors, and request that the Local Agency Formation Commission of Riverside County is hereby requested to take proceedings for the dissolution of CSA 93 described in Exhibit A, according to the terms and conditions stated above and in the manner provided by the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000.
