BACKGROUND:

Summary (continued)

On June 18, 2013 (Agenda Item 3.37), the Board of Supervisors authorized OES to apply for the FY13 SHSP on behalf of the OA. CalOES has awarded the Riverside County OA federal pass-through funding in the amount of \$2,143,822 to enhance local agencies and jurisdictions abilities to prevent, deter, respond to and recover from threats and incidents of terrorism and other catastrophic events. The Riverside County OA will, in turn, pass \$1,638,643 through to 21 cities and agencies. The remaining will be retained for Fire/OES projects.

The lead agency for the SHSP grant is Riverside County Fire - OES, on behalf of the OA.

On December 18, 2002, item 3.26, the County Board of Supervisors appointed the Anti-Terrorism Approval Authority (ATAA) as the review board used for determining the utilization and distribution of SHSP funds. For FY13, ATAA has recommended, and the OA has been awarded, funding for the following projects. The benefit of these 9 projects will be realized among 23 cities and agencies throughout Riverside County:

The OA also offers trainings directly to the communities through the CERT program which provides training to our citizens on how to be self-sustaining and have the ability to help their neighbor during a catastrophic incident. The OA also participates in many emergency preparedness groups that are made up of citizens and businesses and provides emergency preparedness materials and trainings through outreach activities such as safety fairs.

Additional Fiscal Information

This grant is 100% Federally funded through CalOES. The Schedule A attached represents Fire/OES awarded funds in the amount of \$505,179 for COOP & COG; CERT (portion awarded to Fire-OES only), Arson Eq &Training, and M&A only. The remaining \$1,638,643 will be passed through to Riverside County Departments and cities within Riverside County. If any of the other departments require a budget adjustment then it will be included in the 2nd quarter report.
